But you can still enjoy a safe summer by taking a few precautions when it gets hot.


Let me introduce you to the Kimball Friendship Center/ Nutrition Site

Ways to keep cool if you cannot afford air conditioning:

Open your windows at night.

Create a cross breeze by opening windows on opposite sides of the house

Cover windows when they are in direct sunlight. Keep curtains, shades or blinds drawn during the hottest part of the day.

Dampen your clothing with water and sit in the breeze from a fan.

Spend at least 2 hours a day (the hottest part, if possible) in an air-conditioned place.

Other Ideas:

Ask a friend or relative to drive you to a cool place on very hot days if you don't drive.

Don't try to exercise, walk long distances, or do a lot when it's hot.

Avoid the sun.

Take cool baths or showers.

Listen to weather and news reports.




Well, I have never met anyone from Hawaii, so I leaned out the window and gave him the good luck sign back.


The Chamber of Commerce for volunteering their time to drive all the way to Lincoln and back to retrieve the sanitizer from UNL. What teamwork!

Recipe—Ruths Ground Beef Zucchini Casserole

1 lb. Lean ground beef

1 med. Onion, chopped

1 lb. zucchini, unpeeled, chopped

1 can of cream of mushroom soup

3/4 c. grated sharp cheese

Salt & pepper to taste

Seasoned salt to taste

3/4 c. crushed corn flakes

Sauté ground beef and onion; drain. Cook zucchini until tender. Put half of meat mixed in casserole; add zucchini and then remaining meat mixture. Cover with soup and then cheese. Sprinkle with corn flakes. Bake at 350 degrees for 40 minutes.
