Jackson subsequently returned the tapes, although Anka insisted that Jackson had made a copy of the recordings of <i>I Never Heard</i> and retitled the track with his voice to <i>This Is It</i> . Anka allowed Sa-Fire to record <i>This Is It</i> , which she did under the original title, <i>I Never Heard</i> .
