Our book of worship begins Lent with a reminder;

<u>Lent</u> awakens us to hope in God whose "steadfast love endures forever" and to struggle against everything that leads us away from the love of God and neighbor. The Lenten disciplines of repentance, <u>fasting</u>, prayer, study and works of love are guides for returning to the steadfast love of God. During Lent we confess our mortality, our limits and our vulnerability so that we might be transformed and become the new life God calls us to be.

Lent begins in the wilderness. Dedication to God is demonstrated by our actions. We often think of Lent as a time for fasting and practicing self-control. Don't be misled by the notion that fasting is only about food. Lent is also about fasting from our everyday lives and delving deeply into how our lives can be more Christlike. You may want to choose a fast from harmful words or actions. You may want to spread a banquet of Peace, Love and Understanding! Mindfulness training helps us to see how our actions can be positive or negative.

Harry Emerson Fosdick wrote the words to the famous song "God of Grace and God of Glory." This hymn was a song of hope for those living in the darkest moments of the Great Depression; "Cure your children's warring madness, bend our pride to your control. Shame our reckless, selfish gladness, rich in things yet poor in soul." John the Baptist would be proud!

Sometimes the Spirit leads us out into the wilderness, for Jesus, it was John's death, and Herod's oppression. Make me a captive Lord and then I shall be free.

Struggle against everything that leads us away from the love of God and neighbor.



### Bible Study with Kevan

Countless commentaries have been written on the parables of Jesus. Megan McKenna's *Parables: The Arrows of God* is one of the best. She understands how radical these stories were with their grounding in the commonplace and their calls to action.

This Book study and discussion will be held at Trinity UCC beginning on Ash Wednesday, March 5<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm and continue on Wednesdays through March 30<sup>th</sup>.

Review from Spirituality and Practice;

McKenna, author of *Not Counting Women and Children*, views the parables of Jesus as "arrows of God" pointing toward the Kingdom. Here she discusses the stories of the prodigal son, the talents, the hidden treasure, the lost sheep, the laborers in the field, the seed falling on different soil, and the good Samaritan.

The author broadens her discussion of the parables with anecdotes, tales, and stories from Jewish, Sufi, and Hindu traditions. This imaginative strategy has a great payoff — we are challenged to think even more deeply about how our relationship with God is connected to others. It helps us see more vividly how the coming of the Kingdom has little to do with our agendas or security. And it throws in bold relief how God's generosity can animate our compassion.

Megan McKenna has delivered a big surprise to those of us who thought there was nothing fresh left to say about the parables of Jesus. These essays are bold, radical, and renewing. Best of all, McKenna's spin-off parables from other religious traditions will feed your soul for years to come.
