

na's **Parables: The Arrows of God** is one of the best. She understands how radical these stories were with their grounding in the commonplace and their calls to action.

Review from Spirituality and Practice;

McKenna, author of Not Counting Women and Children, views the parables of Jesus as "arrows of God" pointing toward the Kingdom. Here she discusses the stories of the prodigal son, the talents, the hidden treasure, the lost sheep, the laborers in the field, the seed falling on different soil, and the good Samaritan.

The author broadens her discussion of the parables with anecdotes, tales, and stories from Jewish, Sufi, and Hindu traditions. This imaginative strategy has a great payoff — we are challenged to think even more deeply about how our relationship with God is connected to others. It helps us see more vividly how the coming of the Kingdom has little to do with our agendas or security. And it throws in bold relief how God's generosity can animate our compassion.

Megan McKenna has delivered a big surprise to those of us who thought there was nothing fresh left to say about the parables of Jesus. These essays are bold, radical, and renewing. Best of all, McKenna's spin-off parables from other religious traditions will feed your soul for years to come. Books are ordered and will be in soon. Leftover jobs and additions

As with any large job, there are always more small jobs that can be done. The Renovation Team chose to do a few things ourselves to save costs by utilizing volunteers to do the work.

Some of these jobs are to paint the walls at the back stairway to the basement, restore the appearance of those steps and replace/install wall door bumpers, door stops and wall corner guards throughout the building. We already have a volunteer working on these projects.

Another job is to scrape the peeling paint off of the walls in the electrical utility closet in the basement back hallway. These were damaged over the years from the water that had leaked in along the back sidewalk. It needs painted now that the water problem is resolved.

The additions are as follows- a wheeled cart was purchased so there is more portable working space in the kitchen. Heavy metal coat hangers are now on the lower hallway coatracks.

There will always be an ongoing "Honey Do" list to keep our building in shape. Just ask the office if they know of any things that you may be able to do.
