Contribution income was \$1500 over budget for June. As per consistory guidelines, we balanced out the General fund with Endowment funds. we used \$36,863 to balance out the second quarter. Year to date we have used \$80,852 - so effectively our year to date deficit is \$80,852 through June.

We continue to operate as expected.

### Faith Formation and Arts August, 2025


Wow, summer is going fast and I am so looking forward to lots of different activities that are being planned for us to gather together in the Fall!
