Comments:

We had a very strong finish to end 2025! We had contribution income of \$75,555. We want to thank our contributors that donated in December, plus those who answered Pastor Kevan’s appeal to help us out with extra December donations. As a result of this, we were able to pay back \$21k of the Endowment Funds that we had used to balance the third quarter - so we ended up using \$87k of Endowment funds to balance out 2025. Less than the allowable \$107k that was available. Those unused funds are available for future use.

On the expense side, our electric continued above budget, over almost \$400. Building supplies were \$250 over budget as we had a large order in December.

Building Repair Fund/Kitchen Renovation Balance: - (\$252,774)

Please continue to give towards the Kitchen Renovation. 2025 is the second of a three year fundraising campaign. 2026 will be our final and third year. Many thanks for those who have contributed towards the project.

BREAKFAST PROGRAM BALANCE: \$31,905.





Happy February to everyone,

Wait for it... Spring is going to be here, just two more months of wintery weather to get through. With that in mind I want to share some parts of the January Pollinator News Letter from Brooks Berndt.

Dear Pollinators,

As I have previously shared, I am a recovering cynic. It is a struggle—a wrestling match against an underlying sense of powerlessness in the face of the enormous challenges our world faces today. In this bout, the recent U.S. invasion of Venezuela to control its oil threw me to the ground, leaving me flat on my back.

In a Zoom call this week with advocacy coach Sam Daley-Harris and leaders from a range of peace and justice organizations, I began to slowly pick myself up off the floor. During the call, three observations gave me a hand as I got back on my spiritual feet:

1. **Having a vision still matters even in the bleakest times.** During the call, another participant spurred a moment of reckoning for me by quoting the musical *South Pacific*, “If you don’t have a dream, how you gonna have a dream come true?” I realized that I no longer wanted to face the present without a vision for a brighter future, even if the odds seemed stacked against us.

2. **Believing in a vision is easier when you are engaged in action that provides a tangible sense of hope.** In the call, we briefly discussed the details of the current struggle over federal funding in Congress. In the context of seeking meetings with members of Congress and writing letters to the editor, such details are not only helpful; they make hope feel viable.

More than anything, having a community of support is essential. Daley-Harris is the Jedi-training Yoda of chapter-based organizing. As he talked during the call about the importance of having a structure of support for the work of advocacy, I was struck by how hard it would be to sustain any effort for social change as a lone individual. Can one rely upon willpower alone to continually pick oneself up off the floor? Without a community of support, I would have thrown in the towel a long time ago.

In reflecting upon this, I am filled with gratitude for all the churches and Climate Hope Affiliates that are providing communities of support during this critical moment. (And if you don’t yet have a community of support, I can help you start a Climate Hope Affiliate—reach out to me!)

I hope this letter from the Heartland Conference gives you the same spiritual and emotional boost it did for me. I was losing hope in the Environmental Justice movement. Now, I know I am not alone, WE are not alone, there are many faith based initiatives to help the Earth across all sections of our beautiful country. In fact the attachment below will take you to an article from the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel* an affiliate of *USA Today Network – Wisconsin*. The article is about Faith Driving Environmental Activism. This movement is growing steadily and is a grass roots endeavor to obey God’s Words.

“What unites the North Shore Interfaith Green Team is a belief that religious people have a duty to care for creation and a desire to make that happen. Reenie Kavalar, of Congregation Emanu-El B’ne Jeshurun, began the meeting with a reading from the Talmud, a foundational Jewish text.

“See My creations, how beautiful and exemplary they are. Everything I created, I created for you. Make certain that you do not ruin and destroy My world, as if you destroy it, there will be no one to mend it after you,” Kavalar read. She paused and reflected, ‘I’m thinking – if it’s not up to us, who’s it going to be up to?’

Who will it be up to? It is up to us. Watch for more programs coming up that you can join in on and remember Earth Day is April 22nd. Let’s make this year a tidal wave of support for all the Earthlings working to save our world.
