This is something that you really need to know!!! Doing a good thing is good for you. It gets better! The person that receives the benefit of your good deed is the gift that keeps on giving! Kindness is good for you and catching for others!

During our recent building renovation, I have been suggesting that we look at "Church" differently. Too often when we talk about church renovation, we mean the building. I am suggesting that we think about the church as the people. Renovation of the soul is at the heart of our faith practices.

No church structures existed for the first 300 years of Christianity! People understood that wherever they went, "they" were the church. As Mother Teresa said, "God has no hands but ours" What would it look like for you to have a spiritual renovation? What would it mean for you to BE the church?

Several years ago, I was driving toward Trinity and I noticed one of my fellow clergy friends walking along the sidewalk. My friend took a couple of steps to the left and bent over and two more steps to the right reaching down on the curb. As I looked more closely, I saw that he was carrying a small trash bag in his hand. I realized that he was carefully picking up fast food wrappers, random flying papers and anything that was blowing around. I also noticed that he was definitely intentional about this practice while on a walk toward the church he serves. He inspired me to commit to the same practice whenever I had the chance. I went through a "minor" renovation.

Renovation happens when we make a conscious choice. It's good for the person who performs a benevolent task. It is good for the community. People will be inspired by what they see in you. This happens all the time at Trinity. Many of our members renovate our thinking by inviting us to join uplifting programs that are good for everyone.

#### Comments:

Contribution income was \$11k under expectations for August. On the expense side, we paid \$321 for annual back flow testing causing our building maintenance to be over budget. August was a three pay period month, causing our expenses to be \$9k higher.

#### Building Repair Fund/Kitchen Renovation Balance: - (\$288,706)

During August we paid Vince Mariola \$140,363. This includes \$74,563 that was paid to repair all the drains and pipes under fellowship hall and the showroom floors.

#### **BREAKFAST PROGRAM BALANCE: \$29,869**


On Thursday, October 3 at 6:30 pm at the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship on 3186 Burbank Road, Wooster
