#### Comments:

Contribution income was under budget by \$8k for July. On the expense side, we were \$3k under budget. Equipment maintenance was over budget by \$200 as we repaired the air conditioning in the kitchen and Stinky's cleaned out the new grease trap for the first time.

With July deficit of \$12,417 for the third quarter, added to our YTD deficit covered by Endowment for the first half of \$80,852, brings our YTD deficit to \$93,269.

We continue to operate as expected.

"Knit, Pray, Crochet" continues to meet on Fridays at 11:00 in the Parlor. It is a good connection for conversation while doing work with yarn.



This summer the Climate Justice Team has been busy with a major project. Maybe you have noticed that the garden spaces around the church have been weeded and are being prepared for a major renewal. At Trinity we welcome and nurture not just our congregation but a wide variety of guests, including visiting church groups for North Street Mission, the breakfast program guests, AA members, and many more. The front of our church is the first impression we express to the outside world. There is no doubt that this area presents a challenge to keep clean and welcoming. The job we have undertaken is a big one. Not only is there the preparation and planting to be accomplished, but the larger issues of keeping the grounds clean and sanitary after the garden is planted.

Over the summer a plan for the landscaping has developed thanks to our team of dedicated gardeners. A few experts in the field including Doug Anderson, Terry and Greg Moore, Eva D'Intino from the college and all our experienced gardeners have contributed to the vision of a lush and vibrant space around the church. We also appreciate all the work Mike Lilburn has done including finding the water source for a hose and getting the storage area secured.

Here are a few highlights of the plan. The front will be planted in a variety of evergreens and shrubs that will add structure, texture, color, and a more formal appearance facing North Street. These plantings once established will be sturdy and need little maintenance beyond watering and heavy layers of mulch applied yearly. The Buckeye side of the church will be a pollinator garden rich with native



plants and habitat creating wildflowers for butterflies, bees, birds, and other desirable inhabitants. A beautiful bench has been donated by Jamie and Justin Gilmore. We have also been granted through the church, an anonymous donation to help fund this project. Eva D'Intino also donated funds from her operating budget for the Faith and Sustainability program at the College. We are grateful for all the financial help and gifts. We are also thankful for the creative thinking, hard hands-on weeding and digging, and the shared knowledge of plants and landscaping that have contributed to building a vision for making our church grounds beautiful.


Our plans for keeping the gardens clean and tidy will involve ongoing efforts by our team and the congregation at large. One of the pieces of the upkeep will be to bring ownership to the members of the various groups and guests that frequent our church and spend time outside in front of the church.

There will be several phases to go through until this is all accomplished and we will keep the updates coming. On Sunday October 26th Reverend Brook Berndt, the Climate Justice minister from the Heartland Conference will be our guest and give a talk on what being a Climate Justice church means and how to make a difference. There will be a luncheon with questions and answers after church.
