Trinity Friends,

Our Easter observance holds special significance this year. This is our first inperson Easter Sunday in over three years. We last celebrated Easter during our 200th anniversary year in 2019, 2020 was entirely virtual, and Easter 2021 was held at the park.

Our deepest Spiritual lessons are learned when we emerge from our darkest hours. When people of faith were no longer afraid of anything, even the powers of death, they had the power to change the world. When the world grows dark, only then can we see the beauty of the stars and moon. They have been there all along, but our eyes were not ready to see them until the right moment.

We think our fears are well-grounded and that faith is foolishness, yet the Gospels contrast two ways of life. Those who stubbornly cling to fears like Judas, Sanhedrin, and Pilate. If you've been reflecting on the present state of things; in the world, in the nation, in your personal life...There is hope. There is a path. Resurrection teaches us that...The gate of Heaven is everywhere! There is a path to a life of grace and peace. Resurrection-is God's way of saying that we don't know everything. On the other side of a dark night of the soul our values are clarified. We learn that our fears are unfounded and our faith is secure.

TRINITY CLIMATE CRISIS ARTICLE FOR APRIL 2022

As I am thinking about Earth Day, Friday, April 22, 2022, it would be easy to despair, with our T.V.
