Climate Crisis Committee Report

TRINITY CLIMATE CRISIS ARTICLE FOR AUGUST 2022 Once again, as I write this article, climate is in the local and national news. Temperatures over 100 degrees have affected most of Europe, with resulting drought, fires and deaths due to the heat. Our son & daughterin-law can attest to these conditions in Portugal. The Rhine River water level has dropped so low, that it may not be able to be used for transporting goods. Here, in the United States, similar conditions currently exist in our Western states, including Texas, where our daughter & her family have had 100 degrees plus, for much of the summer. Our granddaughter said it was 107 degrees on her 19th birthday and even going to the swimming pool was not a relief from the heat. Our daughter gave up on a garden this summer, as the extreme temperatures just killed whatever she tried to plant. Many ranchers are having to sell their cattle, as they have been unable to grow grain to feed them, due to the drought. Perhaps, due to limited rain in Wooster, you were able, as we were, to skip mowing your lawn for 2 weeks and you noted browning areas. Our daughter, in Mentor, OH., said their ground was so dry that it was cracking in places. As President Biden said on the news today (7/20/22)WE ARE IN A CLIMATE CRISIS! He needs our help to put pressure on the Senate to pass the urgently needed measures to start to counter this crisis. Though these changes are happening even faster, around the globe than the scientists predicted, it is an urgent matter, but not a hopeless one, IF WE GET SERIOUS about making the necessary changes. This Crisis will affect us all, no matter where we live, in one way or another. The conditions out West will ultimately affect their water supply and everyone's food supply. If conditions become intolerable, there will be a migration to other parts of our country to find relief. There is a bright side, if we do what is necessary, our air and water will be cleaner, we will have less heart & lung conditions, fewer cancers, our food quality will be better, more jobs will be created, just to name a few advantages. And THE BIG PLUS, we will be leaving the planet in better shape for our children & grandchildren, so once again their gardens will flourish and they can enjoy a birthday celebration at the pool, or wherever, in comfort!
