

A Lenten discipline should lead to a deeper connection to God, others and your own true self. The words of imposition, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return" remind us of our mortality. Join us in the Sanctuary for our observance as we begin the season of Lent.

Comments:

We ended 2023 with a deficit of \$83,908. We were able to cover the deficit with church reserves. We have a balance of \$90,630 in our church reserves going forward. As required by Consistory, we are reporting a balanced budget for 2023.

December was the strongest financial month of the year. As of the end of November, our year-to-date deficit was \$131,248. In December we had strong income netting a \$47,339 surplus for the month, resulting in the deficit of \$83,908.

Many thanks to those who helped to contribute to our deficit during December. The deficit has been building slowly over a number of years. For 2023, 71% of our church budget was related to our church staff. We will be spending much of 2024 looking for ways to increase giving income and reducing expenses.

Building Repair Fund/Kitchen Renovation Balance:

We had strong donations to this fund, of \$16,075, during December. During December we paid for half of the new kitchen equipment and for all of the new Fellowship Hall Chairs.

Plans to renovate the Fellowship Hall and Kitchen and alleviate the water problem in the basement are underway!



Winter has finally arrived with howling winds, bending trees, and horizontally blowing snow. I must confess, I am glad. Winter may be a harder, harsher time of year, but it is necessary for growth. It gives us time for rest; even the snow nourishes the soil,

Winter reminds me that God the creator has everything planned for us to thrive and grow. All the universe works together for our benefit, even down to each change of season.
