Instead, be humble and give more honor to others than to yourselves. Do not be interested only in your own life, but be interested in the lives of others. In your lives, you must think and act like Christ Jesus." -Apostle Paul in Philippians 2:1-5

Memorize or tape Paul's statement of faith somewhere where you will read it often as Spiritual resolution for the New Year.

Comments:

Contribution income was stronger this month, yet under budget due to the fact that the budget held some of our annual contributor donations. We still expect to see some annual contributor donations in December. On the expense side, we were overall \$3500 under budget. Our office supplies were \$300 over budget and our electric was over by \$234.

With a special year-end mailing, we asked Trinity members and friends to help us out with an additional yearend gift to help us closer to balancing the budget for 2023. We have been struggling more these past few years and hope to be able to change this trend.

Building Repair Fund Balance: + 6,287

We have combined this building repair fund with the Kitchen Renovation project. This then, uses the same accounting procedures that we have used for renovations starting with the major Trinity renovation of the mod 1990's. We received strong donations of \$14,135 in November. We also paid for the first Kitchen Renovation invoice as we paid to have our stove upgraded instead of buying a new one (we paid \$2,028)..


