

# What kind of Kingdom? -

Thoughts on Juneteenth, Hawaii, and General Synod 2021

"The kingdom of God seems so far off," I said to Daniel Kirk, as we discussed racism in the U.S.A. The Kingdom of God represents justice and peace, all things made right, restored and repaired relationships, wholeness, and so much more. He replied, "that's why I think we have to make those spaces here and now." Well, I'm still thinking on this "Daniel Kirk theology," after Juneteenth. How are Trinity UCC members called to create spaces for justice, peace, belonging, restoration, and repentance now?

Did you know there is an example of a real-life Kingdom in the Church today the Hawaiian Kingdom! As General Synod 2021, the largest gathering of the United Church of Christ, meets this month, Hawaiian Christian delegates wrote a resolution that piqued my interest. They ask the United Church of Christ to support the sovereignty of the Hawaiian Kingdom, which was overturned by U.S. occupation in 1893. Did you know that the UCC church initiated an apology to the Hawaiian Kingdom in 1993 for our part in this occupation, and that the national government of the U.S.A. followed our lead? Wow! What would it mean to support a just world for all through Hawaiian sovereignty? ## **Trinity Climate Crisis Committee July**

The climate crisis and beyond : Lin Wierwille: Review of Randy Woodley in Sojourner

I invite each of you to reflect on the May 2021 Sojourner magazine article, "White Supremacy and The fate of the Earth" by Randy Woodley. The opening premise, that change is difficult, is likely one that most of us can agree upon. But his next challenge, "how can we reverse course from the thoughtless and unnatural manner in which humans have continued to interfere with nature" may cause us to turn away or avoid our role in the demise. And next, how does the current climate crisis intersect with our own current health crisis? Is it then, not just exploitation and degradation of families and children. Woodley guides and challenges us to realize that every part of our creation is related and in some measure seeks balance. The closing paragraph of Woodley's article asserts that systemic racism and a world view that whiteness is our most important value can only be tamed by true humility. He asserts that "embracing difference builds both character and community" and that our future "depends on treating the whole community of creation as our relatives". Woodley's article is not just an easy read but challenges all Christians to move to higher ground. Can we accept the challenge not just to face change, but to become "good relatives"?


