Glenn Royer and I used to take turns leading that group on Tuesday mornings; Lloyd Cornelius, Joe Miller, Ida Mae Holland, Evelyn Duell, Mary Soliday, Ken Rhode, were all regulars. Every one of them are gone now. Perhaps you remember many of these people too! We came to know one other well because we shared our faith, our lives and our convictions about the things that matter most each Tuesday. I like to imagine that Pastor Glenn Royer will start up another Bible Study in Heaven now that Ella Mae has joined them! Each Tuesday morning at 10, I will be thinking about them!

Associate Pastor's Message

Beloved Community,

I first want to shout out to the young adults at Trinity, some of whom are receiving this newsletter for the first time. Hi. You are beloved. I am so proud to serve these young adults because they are leading our congregation to think in new ways, challenge ourselves to live our commitments, and celebrate that Jesus loves all. Go, YAHOOS! (That's our young adult group name because we did not want to be stigmatized as "young" but chose to stand for Young Adults Have Outstanding Old Souls.)

This month marks the beginning of Lent, and a special time of renewal of faith. In Lent, we get to express a part of our faith that we often don't: confession of sin. Most UCC churches don't practice regular confession, one reason being the harm that sin language has done to many of us. So, we lift up our strengths and remember our capacities rather than feel beaten down by the language of sin. In many UCC churches, however, we add a confessional prayer every Sunday in Lent as an acknowledgement of the return to God that Lent represents. What is it about confession that I love so deeply? Confession means truth-telling. In lives that want to present only the best and never the worst, always the joys and never the challenges, always the "I can do it" and never the "I need help" - truth-telling can mean a breath of fresh air! Yes, humanity is sinful - meaning, we miss the mark. And, yet, we are capable of repentance - meaning, change. Even in our brokenness, we remain utterly beautiful to God, who sees all of us and loves us still. When we get close to God, the beauty of the journey remains the powerful resurrections we will look forward to. In Christian love,


