

Plans to renovate the Fellowship Hall and Kitchen and alleviate the water problem in the basement are underway!

Before that can happen, we hope to have a French drain installed in the basement. The items in the hallway, pantry and beneath the stairs will need to be cleared out first for the French drain. CREATION CARE AND JUSTICE COALITION

Here we are in the Season of Lent on our church calendar, with Easter to arrive on March 31st, and Spring Cleaning is just around the corner.

The following are a few suggestions to reduce our exposure to toxins and harsh chemicals, while also reducing the amount of our plastic containers.

(1) HOMEMADE LAUNDRY DETERGENT: use 1./4 cup for 1 load of laundry.

Ingredients: 1/4 cup Arm & Hammer Washing Soda

1/4 cup 20 Mule Team Borax

1/2 cup Plain Unscented Castile liquid soap (my daughter used Dr. Bronner's) 4 cups of water

Directions: In a saucepan, boil 2 cups of the water, then add the washing soda and borax. Stir until clear, then take off of the stove.

Add the Castile soap to the remaining 2 cups of water and mix.

Then combine both mixtures and mix well.

If you will not be using the detergent up in 5-7 days, or your laundry area is warm, Label it Clearlv and refrigerate. You may need to stir it before use, as it tends to thicken as it sets.

- (2) WHOLE NATURALS CASTILE SOAP: it is EWG (Environmental Working Group) Verified and Palm Oil Free, Unscented and Organic. It contains olive, argon, jojoba, and other oils. It can be found on Amazon in a 1,/2 gallon container for 5Zq.g9. It comes with directions for how to prepare for use as a body wash, face wash, shampoo, baby wash, etc.
- (3) DRAIN CLEANER: AlkaSelzer Tablet & White Vinegar. Let the tablet & vinegar foam for awhile, when the foaming stops, then follow with hot to boiling water.

(4) DEODORANT AND STAIN REMOVER: White Vinegar makes an economical personal deodor ant. It also works well to spray the underarms of shirts & blouses. etc., prior to laundering, to eliminate odor or, in the case of white shirts, to remove underarm perspiration stains.

- (5) WINDOW CLEANER: Mix White Vinegar & Water in a spray bottle to clean windows.
- (6) BAKING SODA: this can be used in place of harsh cleansers. You can use it to clean stuck on food from a pan or corning casserole. Just add to water in the container and let soak. Use your usual pan scrubber and in the case of corning ware, a nonscratch scrubber, to finish the job, which is much easier after this soaking method.
- (7) SHAMPOO & CONDITIONER BARS: These save plastic containers. But check ingredients just as you would on container types to avoid sulfates, phalates, etc.
