Trinity Friends,

Pentecost Sunday is May 28th! Some of you may remember the custom of wearing red on that Holy Day.

Sometimes the importance of Pentecost is overshadowed by Christmas and Easter, but should be viewed as just as significant. God the Father, God the Son but what about God present with us in the Holy Spirit?

Paul described the Holy Spirit in Galatians 5; "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, competing against one another, envying one another."

One summer a large tomato plant grew up just outside Trinity's front door. Clinging tightly to the handicap button post. The vine seemed to spring up overnight! Throughout the summer, it never ceased producing fruit! It gave red, pear shaped, tomatoes about an inch long for everyone who walked by. As people came and went from the breakfast program, each one took only what they needed and there was never a time when the plant was barren. Where did this plant come from!?!?!? Did a well-intentioned member plant it as a surprise? No one ever claimed so! Did a bird leave the seed in just the right location the prior summer? Did someone cast away a tomato and the seeds took root? We may never know the source of our abundance in an earthly way!

God created us to enjoy abundance and not to close our hands to those in need or keep our gifts to ourselves. The heart of Pentecost people is focused on giving thanks for all that God has freely given. When we focus on Gratitude we move beyond our personal self-interest to the broader concerns of all people. When we share there is always enough. This is the meaning of Communion. The word "Eucharist" itself means "Thanksgiving." We see the Spirit most clearly in the life and teachings of Jesus. Pentecost reminds you not to miss the point that God's Spirit also shines in the lives of the people who sit in the pew next to you.

Trinity Climate Crisis Article

O Lord, all creation is in thy care. Give me eyes to see that every living creature Speaks to us of your love. –A Prayer

In the early morning, in early spring, down in the Funk Bottoms to the southwest of Wooster, the birds are calling. The fog has just lifted, and the still water reflects the clouds overhead. We are searching for the Sand Hill Crane. Our best chance is to listen carefully for the loud far-off gurgles of the crane call or to see their thin brown silhouette in a far field covered with old cornstalks from the Fall. Unlike the herons or egrets, their preference is not the edge of the water, but still close to water, to stand shielded by tall reeds or out in the marsh grasses. The point is, you must go where they are to see them.

This will be the third year Dan and I have participated in the Ohio Crane Survey. We are assigned a plot in the Funk Bottoms to seek out and count all the cranes we can find in the early dawn. It is all over by 8:30. Last year Wayne County had more Sandhill Cranes than any other county in Ohio. We must have a suitable habitat of still water, open land and lots of things for the cranes to eat. The sandhill crane is one of the oldest bird species and has been around for at least 2 million years. But as with many animals that enjoyed and enriched Planet Earth for so long, recently they have run into hard times, and their numbers have started to be of concern. We know now the best way to ensure the survival of this remarkable bird is to conserve their habitat, and thus it is no mere coincidence that they are now so relatively numerous here in Wayne County, thanks to two very precious local places of refuge for both migratory and nesting species—Funk Bottoms and the Killbuck Marsh. Sandhill Cranes migrate from the southern US and Mexico to breed in North America and Canada, then return to warm climates in the fall. Indeed, it is not just our spot on earth here in Wayne County that we need to consider, but the larger fly ways everywhere that these bird use to migrate.

The bald eagle is also thriving in Ohio, in the years after laws were passed banning DDT. Both cranes and eagles are whopping big birds, easily visible and fun to watch. However, consider the little creatures not so easy to see and find. All are precious in both God's eye and should be in ours as well. The little warblers, hummingbirds, monarch butterflies, amphibians and a million other species are struggling to survive a loss of habitat. Remember we have already lost the Ivory Billed Woodpecker, the Passenger Pigeon, and many other fellow members of the living order to over-development, over-hunting, to *overlooking*. So, watch out for even the smallest of beings, even the sparrow. Creation needs to be taken care of, and we are God's stewards.
