### Associate Pastor's Message

Hello, Trinity! September is Suicide Prevention Awareness Month. In honor and respect for mental health care, this month, I invite you to challenge yourself one day to speak up about mental health in your own circles, and to learn more about mental health at <u>www.nami.org</u>.

Sometimes, hope comes from an intervention that is changing the world - 5 million calls have been received on the **988 phone number** since it was instituted in 2022 (NPR, July 2023). More people are reaching out as a result of this intervention.



One verse that speaks to suicide prevention comes from the apostle Paul - who, some intuit, himself felt suicidal at times. Paul writes in Galatians 6:2, Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. If you have lost a loved one to suicide, we are here to listen and be with you. If you have a loved one who is suicidal, or find yourself there today, we will help you find support. God is still speaking, and God's word is a word of hope.

"We are gathered here today in worship and prayer to thank you for the gift of life in all of its splendor and its sorrow. Even in our darkest moments, we are grateful for this gracious gift. But in our celebration of life, we pause to acknowledge that some among us have suffered greatly from the loss of a loved one to suicide. They are crushed with grief, wondering if anything will ever make sense again - if they will ever heal and recover from the devastation of their loss. There are also some among us who find themselves on the edge of despair, either too numb to feel much of anything or full of anxious, dark thoughts of ending their life. Hope has begun to fade and they are holding on by a thread.

God, in these moments, may we remember that we are never alone – not even for a single moment. Thank you for your promise to never abandon us or forsake us, and for the security of your dear presence ever within us. Thank you for the promise that nothing can separate us from your love found in Christ Jesus, our Lord.

Thank you, also, for the reassurance that we don't have to walk this pilgrim path by ourselves; thank you for the sacred companions on the journey—brothers and sisters who are willing to listen to us, cry with us, pray with us, hold us, stand with us in our loneliness, be Jesus-in-the-flesh reminders of your nearness to us, and especially for those who have faith for us when our own faith falters. Thank you, too, for healers in the medical and mental health field with their special expertise and care.

For those who need a fresh infusion of hope, may our [church] provide that hope - hope to hold on, praying expectantly for better days ahead, for the return of joy, and the release of sorrow. May those of us not currently experiencing grief or loss respond to our aching brothers and sisters in pain with tender compassion, so that we will be able to say together Where there is faith, there is hope; where there is hope, there is LIFE. 'In Jesus' name, Amen"



Comments:

Our contribution income was \$4k under budget, while our North Street income was \$1800 over budget as we hosted our last group for 2023. On the expense side, in total we were \$1200 under budget. Office supplies were roughly \$400 over budget as we purchased paper.

We are operating this year with a \$20k higher deficit that we were last year. Last year in July, we received some of our annual contributor's donations which has not happened yet this year.

We do each member and friend of Trinity to consider an additional donation this year to help offset our deficit.

There are several events and opportunities to engage with this fall starting with the excellent film *The Letter*, being shown on Thursday, September 21<sup>st</sup> at 6:30 pm at Westminster Church house. Betty Schuler, the chairwoman of the Climate Change group for the Interfaith Peace and Justice Committee, wrote the announcement below containing all the information you need to know. Please plan on attending this film and bring a friend.

Looking ahead there are a couple more dates for your calendar:

- To celebrate the Season of Creation there will be an Interdenominational service for the blessing of the animals and blessing the harvest at Christmas Run Gazebo, on Wednesday, October 4<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 pm.
- On Saturday, October 14<sup>th</sup> there is a Heartland UCC sponsored retreat at Templed Hills. This retreat will bring together interested members of UCC churches to explore how to build a Creation Care Team for churches in the conference.

#### **ALL THINGS GREEN**

<u>COMING SOON TO WOOSTER</u>: Interfaith Power & Light has made available to congregations' screenings of the film *The Letter*. Wooster Interfaith Justice Committee (of which several members are from the UUFWC) is inviting the community to a screening on Thursday, September 21<sup>st</sup> at Westminster Church House at <u>353 East Pine street</u> in Wooster at 6:30 pm. Parking is available across the street in the Freedlander Theater parking lot.

The documentary film *The Letter* tells the story of the Laudato Si' encyclical letter by Pope Francis seen through the eyes of frontline leaders battling the ecological crisis across continents. Featured are a climate refugee from Senegal; an environmental defender and leader in the Brazilian Amazon; a youth climate activist from India and biologists studying coral reefs in Hawaii. The film features footage from their encounter with Pope Francis, alongside their personal stories and scientific findings.

The Laudato Si' encyclical was published on May 24, 2015. The title comes from the first words "praise be to you", its subtitle is "on care for our common home". It has six chapters, totaling 184 pages. Chapter One, *What is Happening to Our Common Home* "summarizes the scope of current problems related to the environment. Chapter Two, *The Gospel of Creation*, draws on the Bible as a source of insight. Chapter Three, *The Human Roots of the Ecological Crisis*, explores social trends and ideologies that have caused environmental problems. Chapter Four, *Integral Ecology*, presents the encyclical's main solution to ongoing social and environmental problems. Chapter Five: *Lines of Approach and Action*, applies the concept of integral ecology to political life. Chapter Six, *Ecological Education and Spirituality*, concludes the encyclical with applications to personal life.

According to Interfaith Power & Light, the encyclical was written for all people to read and has sparked meaningful discussions in diverse faith communities. The film is also for all audiences, including

teens and older children. Comments by community individuals with interests in environmental problems and from the audience will follow the screening. Plan to attend.
