"Jesus said to Simon, "Don't be afraid; from now on you will fish for people." So they pulled their boats up on shore, left everything and followed him." -Luke 5:11

Trinity friends,

Frederich Buechner wrote that;" The kind of work God usually calls you to is the kind of work (a) that you need most to do and (b) that the world most needs to have done. The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet."

Everyone who is a member of "the" church should have a "Christian" vocation. I emphasize the word "the" because your calling is also your joy. A decision to "The" universal work of the church.

Some people don't catch fish because they don't go to the deep water, and some people don't catch fish because they weren't asked to. But some people don't catch fish because they know more about fish than God.

Simon tells Jesus in an exasperated tone, "Hey, we've been fishing all night. We know fish. The fish don't run in the day."

While you're sitting in the boat, Jesus wants to <u>know</u>; "What is your "Christian" vocation". Where does your deep gladness meet the world's deep hunger?" I don't know too many churches that offer people so many ways to serve than Trinity. When you serve you exercise your faith. You get more than you give. Consider your call.

 - 06-24 Trail Plumbing set up and are advised to open 6 more holes (4in FH and 2 in Head Start) for a total of 7 and additional costs.
 - 06-25 thru 06-27 Turned off water to entire building so The Trenchless Guys could flush, vacuum and dry the lines. Began pipe lining procedure.

Final cleaning of FH floor needed a scrubber that was rented by Vince's crew

- 09-17 Vince does (almost final) walkthrough
- 09-18? Matt Kilbourne moved chairs to FH from 3rd floor. Found minor defects (tears, scratches, missing leg knobs) in 17 chairs. BizChair notified and will replace at no charge.

October

Continued cleaning and returning items to kitchen.

Found scratches in the paint on the metal roll down doors. Magic Garage Door will replace them.

- 10-11 After Breakfast Program was over-cleaned all tables and moved Narthex tables to FH Habitat for Humanity ReStore picked up remaining old black chairs- they have taken approximately 80. Earlier 40 chairs were taken to Janet Burkhart's to be used in the new homeless shelter.

- 11-04 New refrigerator from Commercial Kitchens LLC delivered to replace old one that shorted out. Cost (\$5268) to be included as part of renovation.

November 11-17-23 Vince provided a tentative timeline, with work to be completed in approximately 3 months.

11-27-23 Consistory and Renovation Team agreed that Trinity would stop programming the months of April, May and June of 2024 so project could be done.

Vince agreed to begin April 2024.

Vince provided laminate samples for cabinet colors

December Ordered 158 chairs from Belnick Retail Paid \$5684. These were delivered in January to Justin Gilmore residence until Trinity was ready for them.

2024

January Gave Vince and Martins our final choices for cabinet laminate, counter tops, wall coverings, floor vinyl and paint colors.

Vince drew up plans for cabinets and submitted them to Mock Woodworking.

February Negotiated quote (\$275,172) and got a list of costs from Vince. Cut costs- Deleted laminate on all walls (Use frp), no stainless on walls by dishwasher, deleted hall cabinet by pantry, no cabinet to left of stove, Trinity will final clean. Savings of \$8523

March 03-12-24 Consistory approved quote for \$242,544

03-26-24 Signed contract and paid Vince \$20,000.

Have been moving things out of kitchen and Fellowship Hall for the entire month.

Will be prepping Breakfast items in Parlor, serve at base of steps to Narthex and patrons have choice of taking brown bag with them or eating at tables that have been set up in back Narthex.

April 04-02-24 Demolition of kitchen began. Completed by 04-04

04-08-24 Began French drain Completed 04-12

04-09 to 04-11-24 Found clogged dishwasher vent pipe to roof, leaking in NSM ceiling. Cleared clog, rerouted vent pipe. HLH engineering relocated grease trap to under movable island.

May 05-07 Installed Fellowship Hall flooring. Martins mismeasured (forgot area in front of serving windows) and need to order more.

By 05-17 Installed back hallway flooring

By 05-17 Painted Fellowship Hall

- 05-13 to 05-17 Sewer back up in kitchen. D&L Drain Service cleared clog but got tool stuck in old 1930's cast iron pipe.
- 05-22 Cut hole in Fellowship Hall floor to retrieve tool. Ran a camera thru all basement and back sidewalk pipes and found bad, thin, rusted pipes under Fellowship Hall and old Head Start room all the way to Buckeye Street.
- 05-29 Cabinets arrived and are stored in Fellowship Hall
- June 06-03 Traced more hallway water leaks to an improperly installed PVC pipe under sidewalk in the back. Began digging up sidewalk to repair PVC and install new downspouts. PVC repair competed same day. Downspouts in July
 - 06-04 Met with Vince, Trail Plumbing. and The Trenchless Guys for an explanation of how they will line pipes to seal all possible thin spots. Verbal quote=\$30,000 given to Phil and Melinda.
 - 06-21 A NSM group was scheduled anyway and we will be without water. St James has agreed to allow NSM and office staff use of their rest rooms while Trinity water is turned off.

 NSM group of 10 will relocate to Best Western for a few nights.

Timeline (unofficial)

2023

May-June Team was created and held first meetings to determine what must be done to renovate kitchen and Fellowship Hall

June Consistory, Endowment and Team discussed a 3 year plan. Endowment to allot \$380,000 to start. 1/3 to be raised by congregational giving, 1/3 to be raised in grants and, if \$380,000 not achieved, balance to be paid off by Endowment at the end of 3 years

June-July-August Team discussed/interviewed possible candidates for contractor. Bogner, Campbell, Imhoff were eliminated. Clazak Kitchen and Bath, Riggenbach Kitchen Design, Weaver Commercial, and Vince Mariola Construction did visits and gave estimates.

Mariola was chosen for these reasons- responded guickly and enthusiastically, superior recommendations, drew up initial ideas that were in line with our thinking, easy to work with, willing to work within the budget, handles all permits required, has \$2million liability insurance and can be bonded per job if required, will use his own subcontractors and coordinate work among all of them.

He uses HLH Engineering Consultants (H. Lewis Hinkel) to plan appliance and plumbing configurations.

He uses Eco Seal in Holmes county for French drain work.

He uses Martin Interiors for all flooring.

June-July-August Evaluated appliance vendors that have Hobart brand dishwasher. Vince uses TriMark from Columbus/Cleveland. We also got estimates Skelton's Inc, Mansfield (too much) and Commercial Kitchens LLC Millersburg. Commercial Kitchens visited but was eliminated due to high cost to build new hood and stack to roof for gas convection ovens (>\$25,000).

September HLH Engineering consultants, Lewis Hinkel, began plans for kitchen plumbing. Approved by City of Wooster.

September- December Worked with Tri Mark's Matt Hendrix on choices and prices of appliances. 12-12-23 Signed Tri Mark contract with 50% down (\$30000) to guarantee prices before they were going to be raised at end of the year.

October-thru? Began process of choosing luxury vinyl tile flooring for Fellowship Hall, back hallway, bathrooms and sheet vinyl for kitchen. Paint samples were obtained. Martins provided samples for our consideration.
