July 3 Guest Speaker:

Peter Edwards: Topic Title: “**Project 24K - The Pearson International Airport Gold Heist**”. On April 17, 2023, 20-



34 million dollars of gold bars and cash were stolen from the Air Canada cargo bay at the Pearson International Airport in Toronto. The heist was covered by news outlets around the world. To date, 9 have been arrested, and other warrants have been issued. There is a great deal of speculation as to what happened to the gold, where it ended up, and what it was used for. To date \$5.3 million has been spent on the investigation, and expectations are that the amount will exceed \$10 million. As a crime writer for the Toronto Star, Mr. Edwards covered the story of the heist code-named by the police, **Project 24K**. **Peter Edwards** is the organized crime beat reporter for the *Toronto Star* and the bestselling author of seventeen non-fiction

books and one young adult novel. His works have been published in four languages. Edwards is an executive producer for the Citytv series *Bad Blood* aired on Netflix. His book *One Dead Indian: The Premier, the Police and the Ipperwash Crisis* was made into the Gemini Award-winning movie. His book *Delusion* (published in Europe as *The Infiltrator*) is on the CIA's recommended reading list for staff and agents.



August 7 Guest Speaker:

Presentation title: Jest for the Health of It. Dr. Ken Shonk is best known for his book *Laughter from Womb to Tomb* and his other presentation, *Laughter is the Best Medicine*. As a medical doctor for 40+ years, he



has many amusing stories and anecdotes to get us through some tough times. Dr. Ken Shonk believes that laughter is a universal uniter and wants to educate everyone on the importance of laughter and leading a joyful life to maintain health and well being. After close to 1000 speaking engagements, he has entertained diverse audiences and brought his wisdom from a 40 year medical practice to share humorous anecdotes and the science of laughter, as he challenges audiences to actively find humour in order to increase their well being.

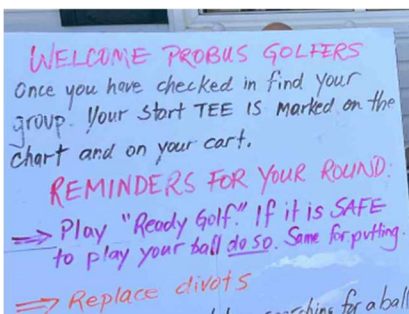






Event Review – Nine & Dine at Sunnybrae Golf Club
