Greenwood's Code Enforcement Department is responsible for the inspection, investigation and reporting of code violations of certain provisions of the city's Municipal Code, which regulates a wide variety of subjects in an effort to maintain a civil society and a community of the highest quality. The following is a general list of City of Greenwood ordinances that are commonly a problem in our neighborhood in the summer months. This is not an all inclusive list, nor is it verbatim from the ordinances referenced. Please refer to the city web page listed above for a full list of ordinances and how to report violations.

Parking: (Ord. No. 06-05, §1, 3-6-06) Generally, no parking within 20' of a sidewalk, intersection, or hydrant, or 6' of a driveway. *Given that we live in a zero-lot-line neighborhood, the city generally overlooks the 6' rule as long as mailboxes are not blocked.*

Trash/Debris: § 6-291. Garbage, Refuse, and Trash. (a) Accumulation of Rubbish or Garbage Prohibited. *All exterior property and premises shall be free from any accumulation of rubbish and garbage.* (c) Weekly Removal of Garbage Required at Private Residences or Dwellings. Every person owning or controlling, whether as principal or agent, or occupying any private residence or dwelling, which by reason of said occupancy accumulates garbage shall keep such garbage in suitable containers which shall be properly disposed of at least once a week. (e) Location of Refuse Containers. For residential properties, when not placed at the curbside for pick up, *all refuse containers shall be maintained beyond the front yard building line.*

Trash/Recycling: Greenwood provides weekly trash pickup and recycling On Tuesday. Trash and recycling must be curbside by 7 a.m. Residents are allowed five (5), 30-gallon containers or bags per week. Heavy trash pick up is the last full week each month.
