ID BADGE POLICY

The Celebration Residential Owners Association (CROA) Board approved the following resolution to the current ID Badge policy:

A passholder may bring no more than four non-resident guests outside of their immediate family on any given occasion unless under a scheduled event, private party, etc. The passholder must remain with the guest(s) at all times. In order to avoid conflicts or disappointments, please contact Town Hall if you are having a party in one of the parks or playgrounds.

HOA ASSESSMENTS

Celebration Residential Owners Association assessments are due on the first day of every January, April, July and October. After the last business day of those months, payments not posted to accounts will begin to accrue late lees and interest. Please allow 10 business days for mailing and processing. Statements are mailed out 30 days prior to the due date. If you do not receive a statement or if you have a question regarding the balance of your account, please contact Town Hall at 407-566-1200 between 9 a.m. and 5:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. You can make a one-time payment using eCheck (electronically debited from your checking account), Visa, MasterCard, American Express, or Discover*. 



COMMUNITY UPDATES FROM THE CROA BOARD



End of Year Perspectives

As we approach the end of this calendar year, we welcome so much within our Celebration community. It's a traditional celebratory time for so many, yet it is also an appropriate time for reflection. Reflection is valuable, as it helps each of us grow and improve in so many ways. From a national and international perspective, December begins (on the 1st) with World AIDS Day, it encompasses National Drunk and Drugged Driving Prevention Month, and it includes Hanukkah (7th - 15th), Christmas (25th), Kwanzaa (starting the 26th) and New Year's Eve.

This column in the Celebration News is prepared each month on behalf of the Board of Directors of the Celebration Residential Owners Association (CROA); it is intended to offer some general information helpful to residents and guests regarding what is happening with our homeowner's association. Additional details about highlights here - and many more activities and services are provided on our website (www.celebration.fl.us), in this and other editions of the Celebration News, the Town Hall-managed Facebook page, and other social media outlets. In addition to these platforms, there are two regular email blasts: the Friday Flash, which highlights various events sponsored by CROA and other community groups, and the Monday Matters, which is intended to emphasize administrative, managerial, or policy-based items. All of these, and so many of our association's services, are managed by the Town Hall staff, employed by GrandManors. Of course, participating in Board and committee meetings (in person, online, or reviewing minutes) helps with a more complete understanding of all that is happening within our community.

This month highlights the fourth of our five cornerstones – Technology. As highlighted on our website, "From the beginning, Celebration has embraced technology as an essential means of connecting people. To accommodate future advancements, Celebration is prepared to evolve with technology as it changes, helping to ensure that technology will continue to do exactly what it is intended, to bring people together." This is exemplified in so many ways, as December has the Winter Solstice, the longest night of the year, on the 21st; appropriately, that is National Flashlight Day. Also, the week of the 6th to 12th is Computer Science Education Week. December 5th has

two noteworthy events – one is National Communicate with Your Kids Day, an opportunity to emphasize human interaction with the appropriate use or non-use of technology. It is also Walt Disney Day, honoring the birth date of a man who exemplified innovation and technology from his earliest days as an illustrator, cartoon-maker, film producer, theme park developer, and more.

In December, several events are provided for our community. On December 1st, we host Kid's Night Out and Tinsel & 'Tinis.' The Celebration Foundation sponsors its infamous annual Holiday Home Tour and Winter Wonderland on the 2nd and 3rd of the month. Also, a Saxophone Solo by Don Black is offered on the 8th at Lakeside Park. More details are found through the various communication channels.

Turning to CROA's operations, the Board has identified volunteer residents to serve on its Master Plan Advisory Group, which will be active over the next several months. This group will help develop priorities for CROA facilities, amenities, and resources, building upon previous studies and reviews. Technology highlights include initial work in collaboration with the CCDD on a resource for reporting repairs and areas needing attention (to replace CeleService) and continued rollout of Wi-Fi availability throughout the community. Also, in late October, CROA director Jim Hays resigned from the Board after several years of service; he was the initial chair of our Technology Committee, served as a Board member, and was the liaison for several community groups. We thank Jim for his years of service to our community.

As the year ends, we are grateful for our Celebration community. We reflect upon each of our cornerstones and think about ways we can continue to use them as anchors for our lives moving forward. The Board, Town Hall staff and management wish each of our residents a healthy and safe holiday season and a sound foundation for an even more celebratory New Year in Celebration. •



Holiday Decorations

Celebration has enjoyed a time-honored tradition of having decorations, holiday lights, and events this time of year, and this year promises to be no exception. As everyone is planning their outdoor decorations, the District office wants to remind you of a few things related to Celebration CDD ("District") facilities, and what is and is not permitted within the District rights-of-way:

Absolutely no power cords or other trip hazards may be placed on or over the District sidewalks. You may do whatever you wish behind the sidewalk on your own property, but the District sidewalks must be kept free of all encumbrances and hazards.

No decorations are permitted on any directional signs, traffic signs, speed limit signs, or street name signs. Some of these are DOT signs, and others are District signs. All must be kept free and clear.

Due to liability issues, do not decorate any of the street light or alley light poles. We do not want any residents endangering themselves hanging streamers or decorations from these poles. We need the pole identification tags to remain visible, and our staff must be able to perform maintenance from time to time.

Residents may decorate the District trees in the rights-of-way, so long as the method used to attach decorations is not invasive (for example, no nails, staples, tacks, or other invasive means). Ribbons, fishing line, dental floss, and other hanging methods are completely acceptable. Please make sure your decorations are properly secured so as not to blow off and do not hang lower than 14 feet over the sidewalk to avoid people and emergency vehicles from running into them.

COMMUNITY STANDARDS

The community of Celebration derives its unique character from a mix of compatible architectural styles and the cooperation of all owners in upholding minimum design, landscaping, and aesthetic standards. A well-kept home appearance increases property values for everyone.

Mold and Algae on Roofing Surfaces

The high humidity of Florida creates a recurring outdoor maintenance problem: mold and algae on exposed surfaces. After a few years, the "new roof look" turns to discoloration that makes your home look older and weatherworn.

Molds are types of fungi and are everywhere in the natural environment. Molds produce "spores" that are spread through the air and can be spread by water and insects. Mold grows and multiplies wherever there is a suitable place to grow, a nutrient source, and moisture.

Green algae can be found in shaded areas with moisture, such as surfaces on the north side of buildings or roofs under the shade of a tree.

Green algae can make a surface very slippery.

The gray or black streaks or splotches on asphalt shingles or roofing tiles are black algae. Black algae can live on roofs and sidewalks exposed to intense sunlight due to the pigmented protective dark color that protects it from the sun.

CLEANING YOUR ROOF

Cleaning the roof enhances the "curb appeal" of your home, but it is a dangerous job and should carried out by a professional. There are several commercial cleaning companies you may hire to provide this service.

However, if you choose to do the work, here are some helpful points.

Safety First! Besides using ladders and hoses, walking on steep, wet, and slippery surfaces is hazardous enough, not to mention the possibility of cracking a tile. A professional service may use a padded sheet of plywood to distribute the weight of the technician while working on the roof.

The cleaning method is dependent on your home's type of roof: Asphalt shingle or tile. It would be best if you did not pressure wash Asphalt shingles the water pressure will loosen and remove the protective granules embedded in the shingles. A chemical agent is best for asphalt shingle cleaning. Use a cleaning agent that is also safe for the environment, as the runoff will certainly splash onto your plants and lawn.



Tile roofs can be pressure washed. The use of a safe cleaning solution will make the job easier. Ensure the professional uses the correct pressure settings so as not to damage the tiles and uses cleaning solutions and techniques appropriate for the tile.

Finally, after cleaning the roof, you will need to clean the debris out of the gutters, ensuring proper water flow and that any French drains are not clogged.

WHAT YOU CAN DO - PREVENTIVE MEASURES

Trees near your home contribute to roof discoloration by providing shade that keeps moisture on the roof and the buildup of debris that aids the growth of mold and algae. By keeping trees trimmed away from your home, you help delay the growth of mold and algae on the roof and sides of your home. Have branches that touch the roof or sides of your home removed? Trim the trees surrounding your home so that there is an unrestricted air flow between your home and the trees. This will also help keep the gutters clear of leaves and insects away from your home.

Cleaning your roof is a recurring task in humid Florida, but the results always enhance the overall beauty of your home. •





CROA ELECTIONS

With fall winding down and the holidays just around the corner, it will soon be time to usher in the New Year and a new CROA Board of Directors.

In 2024, we will be looking for a few good men and women to fill the four (4) open positions on the Celebration Residential Owners Association (CROA) Board of Directors.

Governed by a seven-member Board of Directors, the Board, working side by side with Management, has a goal to protect and maintain property values by promoting an enjoyable, safe, and community-oriented neighborhood. Included in the maintenance is the responsibility for the operation, care, and upkeep of common areas, which includes contract management for the repair and improvements. The common areas include CROA owned buildings, parks, pools, and playgrounds.

THE PROCESS...

- A "Call for Candidates" will be mailed to each owner this month. The Celebration Community Charter defines the owner as "persons holding the record title to a unit."
- Owners interested in running will have until January 3, 2024, to complete and return their "Declaration of Candidacy" to Town Hall. These forms will be made available on the Celebration website or by emailing townhall@ciramail.com. The three candidates with the most votes will each serve a three (3) year term, while the candidate with the fourth highest vote total will serve a one-year term, finishing the term of a Board member who stepped down earlier in 2023. The call for candidates is also mailed to the address of record for each property. The ballots with online voting information are also mailed to all addresses of record for each property when the polls open.
- Information, including biographies provided by each candidate, will be posted on www.celebration. fl.us and published in an upcoming edition of the Celebration News. This material will give you an idea of the candidate's background, qualifications, and why they want to serve.
- In addition, a candidate forum will be scheduled prior to the election deadline to give residents an opportunity to get to know the candidates face to face as well as discern their positions on various topics of interest and concern to owners.
- Each of these positions will be filled on an at-large basis. In other words, all candidates participating in this election will be eligible for one of the four open seats. The top four (4) candidates with the most votes will fill the open positions.
- Election results will be announced at the Annual Meeting on Wednesday, February 28, 2024.

OSCEOLA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE HOSTS 2ND HUMAN TRAFFICKING & DRUG ABUSE AWARENESS CONFERENCE

In an effort to fight human trafficking in Osceola County, the Osceola County Sheriff's Office, in partnership with the Kissimmee Police Department and St. Cloud Police Department, hosted the 2nd Human Trafficking & Drug Abuse Awareness Conference at the Wyndham Orlando Resort and Conference Center in Celebration on November 2nd, 2023.

The conference educated representatives from the hotel industry on indicators of human trafficking. Typically, narcotics play a substantial role in traffickers controlling their victims. Sheriff Marcos Lopez and guests brought awareness to hotel industry employees about the aspects of human trafficking that often go unnoticed.

The goal of this event is for hospitality employees to alert law enforcement when they see those indicators. This is critical for the success of investigations and ultimately holding traffickers accountable for their crimes. Since hotels and motels are sites for sex and trafficking business operations, our agency wants to ensure that the front-line staff is well-trained in identifying potential signs of the sex trade.

During the event, a new initiative was announced to provide information and support to victims of human trafficking: the Let's Stop Human Trafficking Stickers to help stop the sex and labor trafficking of women, men, and children. The stickers can be strategically posted in public restrooms in the county.

The Let's Stop Human Trafficking Stickers contains the emergency number 911 and the hand signal for human trafficking. To make the signal, individuals hold the palm open, tucking the thumb and then closing the fingers over the thumb. The purpose of victims giving this signal is for those who are receiving it to know that a victim is seeking help.

The Osceola County Sheriff's Office will offer these stickers to the community to help combat human trafficking and drug abuse. 



Woodworking has experienced many changes in the past decade. This article will cover a few of those changes:

- 1. People under the age of forty seem to have lost interest in making things for themselves and others at the same time; the baby boomer generation is either slowing down or has quit the process either because ailments have robbed them of steady hands or the ability to lift the wood/projects, or they downsize or relocate to where a wood workshop is no longer viable. The need for more interest means the universe of woodworkers is shrinking. Those younger than forty who have found the inspiration of woodworking are producing some fantastic pieces with their prices reflecting an honest, fair payment for the materials, time, and expertise that you can find on websites like Etsy, Pinterest, YouTube, Facebook Marketplace, etc... Unique, one-of-a-kind pieces are being made of hardwood with quality construction for those who can afford them, far above retail.
- 2. Woodworking magazines have adapted to the new environment with mergers, expiring along with so many other print media, or their pages are focused on three groupings: the woodworker new to the hobby or career, those experienced but wanting to learn or develop new skills, and the advanced/experienced woodworker who enjoys seeing what others are making or helping to mentor or produce quality pieces that others will appreciate because their residence has reached the absorption limit.
- Decorating preferences have changed so that every three to five years, people change their style, look, and abode emotes. The furniture manufacturers have adapted their product lines to accommodate these new preferences with lowercost materials (if you look carefully a lot of the furniture available today is particle board that crumbs apart in three to five years, necessitating the purchase of a new cycle of furniture), labor content (CNC machines which are computer driven routers will repetitively produce tons more of the exact parts requiring only a person to load the next piece of wood positioned correctly and then start the process over again and again for multiple CNC machines), and time to get product to the marketplace—fad furniture at its worst. Family heirlooms get rejected. Classical pieces that for a couple of centuries were prized pieces of hardwood furniture that people saved money for years to acquire are only prized by older generations that appreciate the quality of Stickley, Green and Green, Chippendale, Windsor, Art Deco, Queen Anne, Shaker, Colonial, Hepplewhite, or Pennsylvania Dutch. We seem willing to forget and ignore our historical heritage for expediency.
- 4. Woodworking tools are now available in categories of quality, which is OK for the casual user who only needs a cheap tool for a one-time project. The days of a brand being understood as the gold standard are slipping by us. Quality tools keep evolving, too, as battery technology is evolving from new materials for cordless tools, affording each generation of tools to be lighter weight (more straightforward to handle and use all day long) and more powerful. More and more tools are becoming cordless. Recently Bosch introduced a cordless battery that will power multiple brands as opposed to being required to use a battery that works only with a specific brand. This means making brand loyalty disappear so the woodworker can now be freed to purchase the best in class for each tool.

T'is the holiday season when woodworkers are busy in their workshops making wood gift items for people unique to them. Have you dropped enough hints about the cutting board, charcuterie serving board you've been eyeing but found too expensive in the store, book rack, wooden brain teaser puzzles or games, wine rack, bowls, cooking/serving utensils, etc? Here's hoping you receive the wooden gift you want from your favorite woodworker. •




