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

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## Happy New Year!



#### What to Expect in the 2024 Election

VOTE HOA NOW

The upcoming 2024 Board of Directors election is right around the corner, and our primary goal is to ensure that every homeowner is well-informed about the process ahead. With the Board of Directors' decision to transition from TXT2Vote to Vote HOA Now, all election notifications will be delivered to homeowners digitally. What can you expect to receive? Homeowners will receive the call for candidates and voting information via email, with a physical postcard mailed separately, providing Annual Meeting details.

The Call for Candidates will be sent digitally to the email listed in the homeowner's HOA Account Portal (distinct from the Constant Contact subscription). If you need to update your account email, please visit **vmsweb.ccmcnet.com**. The Call for Candidates email will feature a letter from the Executive Director and a direct link to the Candidate Interest form on **myvistancia.com**. If you need assistance with accessing your account, please contact Customer Service at 480-921-7500.

Following the Call for Candidates email, homeowners can anticipate an official email from Vote HOA Now containing personal voting details, including a unique voter PIN. For more information on what the email will look like and tutorials on how to vote, visit **votehoanow.com**. It's crucial to receive emails from Vote HOA Now, and in case of any issues locating the PIN, or if an email is not received, homeowners are encouraged to contact the Communications Manager, Cullen Boswell.

The only physical mailing homeowners will receive is the Annual Meeting Notice postcard, with brief information about the Annual Meeting, where to locate the candidate bios and information, and voting instructions (excluding each resident's unique voter PIN).

It's worth noting that while digital voting is an option, homeowners can also vote via paper ballot by voting in person or by requesting a ballot via email through the Executive Director. Throughout the election process, regular updates and reminders will be posted on **myvistancia.com** and in our weekly eNews to keep homeowners informed.

## Winter Water Management

#### Water Wisdom

#### Are your trees and shrubs on the same value?


Many systems have been installed with one value to water plasts of different types and sizes. In the example on the Ran Tame Worksheet (page 10), trees, shrubs, and succulatus are all watered on the same value. Since these plasms have different watering needs, it would be more efficient to have them watered by different values.

However, we can water this landscape more efficiently by making some simple changes to the emitters. If we add two emitters to each tree and change the emitter output on the succelents from 1 gallon per lower to V1 gallon per hour, the run times would be adjusted in line with one another. Here's how the example sould look after adjustments:



 Here are some other ideas for modifying your system
 Hand water smaller plants that cannot survive longer frequencies between waterings.

Place organic mulches around smaller plasts to slow ecoporation.
 Plog all emitters around your trees and use scalar hoses periodicitly instead.



In most households, the majority of water used is applied to the landscape. But now that the winter months are bringing cooler, wetter weather, you have an opportunity to reduce your water usage and save money on your water bill. In addition, using less water helps save valuable resources for those summer months when plants, turf and trees need extra hydration.

Here are some tips and tricks that you can use to reduce water usage while still maintaining a healthy landscape:

- As the weather continues to cool down, adjust your watering frequency and run time. You can use the interactive tools at wateruseitwisely.com to determine how often and how long the stations on your irrigation controller should run. If you have a desert-adapted landscape, you can usually turn off your irrigation system from Thanksgiving to Valentine's Day.
- Take advantage of every rainfall. Turn your clock to the "off" or "rain" position and monitor plants for the first signs of wilting before reactivating.

- 3. Check to make sure your irrigation system is not leaking. With everything off, inside and out, observe the dial on your water meter (usually located in the front yard). If it is still turning, there is water leaking somewhere.
- 4. Test the moisture depth in your soil. A screwdriver will move easily through moist soil when it is wet but will stop when it reaches dry soil. The roots of most shrubs are about 6" to 18" deep, grass roots are about 4" deep, and a large tree will have most of its roots within the first 24".
- The irrigation to your Bermuda turf should be off. You can water once a month in spots with rocky and sandy soil that dries out quickly, like at Vistancia. This helps the grass roots to stay hydrated.
- 6. If you are watering Ryegrass or plants, try to water in the evening. If water gets on sidewalks or driveways it will dry before it has a chance to freeze in cold temperatures.

#### How frequently should you water?

The Run Tane Workshort helps you determine here long to wants, but how often to watter can be one of the most difficult quotients to answer. Notice that the Landscape Matering Gaidelines is divided into seasons. It is important to adjust pour watering schedule at least seasonally, because plants can use 3 to 5 times as much water during the hot, dry summers as they do during the winter.



If you look at the Guidelines fair the spring watering frequency for desert adapted trees, you'll see that the recommendation is 14 to 30 days, How do you determine if it should be every 14 days, every 30 days, or somewhere in between? Besides the current weather conditions, watering frequency depends on a number of factors:

#### Mart type Soil type Plant size Plant establishment

These factors are discussed in more detail on the next two pages.

#### Water Wisdom

This irrigation chart can help you set your irrigation system correctly. Winter rains can nourish your landscape for several days; turn your irrigation off to save water and water costs.



It feels as though 2023 was one of the busiest years for the city of Peoria – and the Mesquite District. We saw everything from new commercial and residential developments to a new school, employment centers and entertainment districts. I want to take a moment to reflect on these accomplishments and give a huge thank you to the city staff that took council's vision and made these projects possible. It's no easy task to care for a city of this size, and I'm grateful that we can continually work together to serve Peoria residents in the best way possible.

A top priority for Peoria, and most certainly the Mesquite District, continues to be the future of water. The city has invested millions into enhancing and diversifying our water portfolio. Projects included the building of five new wells in the district to serve future developments, increasing capacity at current water treatment plants like the Jomax facility and expanding access to reclaimed water (purple pipe). These projects will continue into 2024, along with a host of new investments. To help the public stay informed about these investments, Peoria launched a new video series, "Ripple Effect: Our Water. Our Future", with the first episode highlighting the \$170 million budget commitment this year. New episodes will be released monthly at **youtube.com/digitalpeoria**.

Another important investment continues to be in the field of public safety. As the fastest growing district in the city, it's critical that the city provides the necessary resources that ensure the safety of Mesquite residents. Resources such as a new public safety facility located north of the CAP Canal to house both the police and fire personnel (yet another important resource). Last year the council approved a budget that included funding for four new school resource officers and 11 new officers. In addition, Fire Station 196 gained a new rescue unit providing additional medical and rescue response for the surrounding area.

The Mesquite District is no stranger to development and last year we saw our fair share of construction at seemingly every corner. 2023 brought in **Harkins Theater**, a new steakhouse, and plenty of retail and medical space. Plus, the approval of **5 North** will usher in a whole new vibe and entertainment amenities to the Vistancia area. 2024 will be just as busy with all types of new development. Retail remains strong as the Vestar project at the Four Corners wraps up in the the new year and construction at the **Trailhead** begins as well. Additional office space, hotel and medical facilities along Lake Pleasant Parkway will be getting started, while details about the highly anticipated **Amkor** facility will also be released.

As always, I continue to advocate for community involvement on all projects big and small. From community meetings to city council meetings, there are always opportunities for residents to have their voices heard. This was the case last year when two separate developments withdrew applications following resident feedback, and again when council voted to fund the specific West Wing trail option that was supported by local residents. This is the type of resident engagement I love to see.

In closing I want to wish everyone a very happy and healthy holiday season. Peoria is such a wonderful place to live and at the heart of it all are residents like you and I who continue to care for our community.

## New Year, New Focus On Making A Difference
