His wife, Ma. Carmen, said behind her husband's artwork is the story of an artist's struggles and triumphs at his second chance at life and how his art enabled him to transcend from the physical effects of a paralyzing set back in 1999 to an even more meaningful existence in this world.

"This is to us a moment of thanksgiving, indeed," she said.

In 2019, he had his farewell exhibit at the Philippine Center in New York after living there for over 20 years. He wanted to be here in his native land, Ma. Carmen said.
