These details are imperative to be sure our program is on the right track! It's important to keep us advised of any changes of address or contact information. Your pup will be microchipped with lifetime chip registration. Keeping that information current is vitally important in getting your pup reunited with you should he ever get separated or lost. The Australian Shepherd is a medium size, active breed which sheds its coat biannually. They will do fine with weekly brushing, professional grooming monthly (deshed and outline trim only), and should NEVER be shaved. They are curious and need to remain mentally active and involved with their family in order to maintain a solid temperament. Aussies will show guardian behavior, including barking to alert for changes in the environment. Because they are a herding breed, they can chase and nip at the heels of young children as well as other animals and moving objects. Prolonged confinement and neglect can produce aggression in this breed. They can be a sensitive dog and do not respond well to hard handling and/or loud reprimanding. Positive reinforcement methods, regular training and socialization as well as a structured, loving home life are best for the Australian Shepherd.
