In the last 30 days together the students have answered 4,882 questions, mastered 81 skills, and are proficient in 106 skills. Overall the scholars made progress in 144 skills. As of June 25th, some of the awards the students accomplished in IXL include spending 10 hours practicing language arts skills, achieved excellence in 10 kindergarten math skills, and achieved excellence in 5 third grade language arts skills.
