In preparation for finishing another room on the third floor of the museum, we have gotten quotes for the electrical work. This includes pulling new wires to the lights and switches, and installing electrical outlets in the two southwest rooms. This work is nearly finished. Redoing the walls will have to wait for either grants or more money coming into the museum coffers. We are also getting estimates on the work needed in the auditorium. We'd like to re-vamp and modernize the lighting. With the stage expansion, it is often difficult for the musicians to see their music. The present stage lights are wholly inadequate and questionable for safety. We'd like to install new light-blocking drapes on the windows in order to better control the light conditions in the auditorium. The present Venetian blinds are not adequate for this purpose. We also need to buy new seats. The current seats have rivets that are wearing out, causing the seats to collapse, which is creating a safety hazard. We feel these upgrades are warranted and hopefully we can find the funds to cover the cost of the upgrades

JERI KLEPPIN IS BUSY WITH THE MANY HUNDREDS OF PHOTOS THE FAMILY HAS SUPPLIED.

KAREN MILLICAN AND VERLA SMITH HAVE CREATED A NEW DISPLAY ON THE SECOND FLOOR. OUR BEAUTIFUL "FLAPPER ERA" DRESSES AND ARTIFACTS ARE NOW READY FOR THE COMING SEASON. THESE LADIES HAVE ALSO SPENT MUCH TIME BRINGING THE "SCHOOL ROOM" UP TO SNUFF, AND ARE COMPLETING A DISPLAY ON THE THIRD FLOOR LANDING USING ARTIFACTS FROM THE 50'S. THESE TWO ARE ALSO ENGAGED IN DEEP CLEANING OUR ROOMS IN ADVANCE OF OUR SPRING OPENING, MAY 31ST.
