

Get the Context: Learn about Hispanic Historical Research

Colorado's steeped in history, Hispanic history, that is. In 1598, all territory drained by the Rio Grande, including the San Luis Valley of present-day Colorado, was claimed for Spain by explorer Don Juan de Oñate. Learn more about the early Hispanic settlers with us.

Learn more about El Camino Real, the main path used to transport people and goods from Mexico City to Santa Fe. Spanish Mexicans migrated north to the southwestern part of present-day Colorado.

Learn more about land grants, the Baca ranch, water rights and acequias and the "commons" used by Hispanic settlers. Learn about Bent's Fort and Fort Garland. Learn more about the resources are available through the Colorado Historical Society and its branches and the Denver Public Library and its Western History and Genealogy Division. The Society partners with these organizations to provide speakers, seminars and events.
