

# NON-DISCRIMINATION NOTICE

## **HOW TO FILE A GRIEVANCE**

If you believe that **San Fernando Recovery Center** has failed to provide these services or unlawfully discriminated in another way on the basis of sex, race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, ethnic group identification, age, mental disability, physical disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, gender, gender identity, or sexual orientation, you can file a grievance with Los Angeles County Department of Public Health, Bureau of Substance Abuse Prevention and Control. You can file a grievance by phone, in writing, in person, or electronically:
