

DOUGLAS COUNTY FARM BUREAU

VOTING MEMBER SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Eligibility: Applicants must be a voting member of the Douglas County Farm Bureau or a dependent of the same. Applicants must enroll and attend as a full time student and must show evidence of minimum 2.5 G.P.A. (based on 4.0 scale). Scholarships will be sent to an accredited four-year college/university, junior college, or vocational/technical school only.

Applications must be submitted to the office before April 1, 2023.

Selection of Recipients: Applications will be screened by a committee appointed by the Douglas County Farm Bureau Board of Directors. Preference will be given to those with an interest in agriculture.

Notification of Recipients: The recipients will be notified of their selection by mail. If for any reason the recipient cannot use the scholarship, another recipient will be selected. If no applicants are found to satisfactorily fulfill the scholarship requirements, no scholarship will be awarded. Applicants will be reviewed, determination made, and recipients notified by May 15, 2023.

Receipt of Funds: The scholarship will be sent directly to the financial aid office of the specified school.
