

#### DID YOU KNOW .....

.....that in 1861, the cornerstone for this building that you're sitting in was laid, and the church was dedicated in 1862? The construction cost \$18,000 and the congregation had 400 members. However, the congregation dates back to the pre-Revolutionary era when the first building and cemetery were erected on the site at 291 Main Street where our "chapel" is now located. The original building was sold in 1819, and a second church was built and was used until the current sanctuary was completed.
