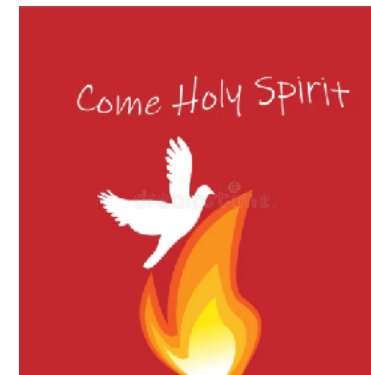


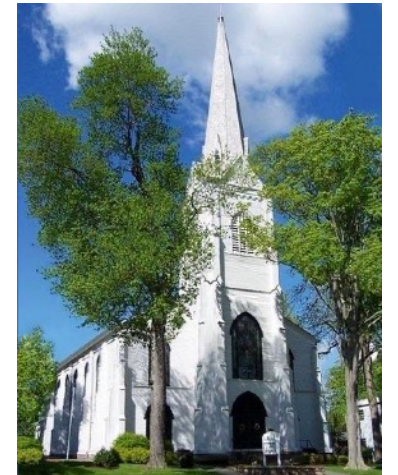

A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

I knew I was called to youth and children's ministry. While serving as chaplain at Johnsonburg Camp over two summers, I could feel the voice of God say, "This is what I want you to do." I spent my days walking through camp and playing games with children, teaching them about the Bible, singing songs, pointing out God's presence in their lives, and walking alongside the large young adult staff. I felt alive when I could put my toes in the water from the "lake" and say a simple prayer for the ministry that was before me. The beauty of God's creation called out to me at that time. But that call to walk alongside youth and children was not one that I just "felt" on my own; it was one that was affirmed by the various communities I served in and through the voice of the churches I visited.

Eventually this call would lead me to serve as Director of Christian Education at St. John's Presbyterian church in Devon, PA and then as Director of Youth Ministries at Westminster Presbyterian Church in West Chester. What joy it brought to my life to see children and youth share the awe and wonder of God together. I still remember the little girl who picked at the stockings on my leg while I did a children's message one Sunday and the youth who felt so excluded everywhere else in his life but felt at home at the church. These stories are the part of the fabric of who I am now as a minister. For my call now is to use gifts as we walk together at First Presbyterian Hackettstown.

This summer I will have the tremendous gift to return that call, as I will be the Keynote Speaker for Montreat's youth conference in July. Montreat Conference Center is located in Montreat, North Carolina. Set among the beautiful Blue Ridge mountains, it is a spiritual home to many in the Presbyterian Church. While there I will have the tremendous gift of sharing with the youth about our theme Wonder and Wander. I am super excited to be sharing God's stories with close to 2,000 people over two weeks! Days will be filled with prep, sharing community with people, and more! Youth will share in small group time, worship, recreation time, and time with their home groups. Being at Montreat is a life changing experience.

God has an amazing way to grow you and use you in ways you never thought you'd expect. I covet your prayers as I prepare for this amazing experience this summer. Please know that I am taking you with me - and everyone will know that I am from First Presbyterian Church of Hackettstown!

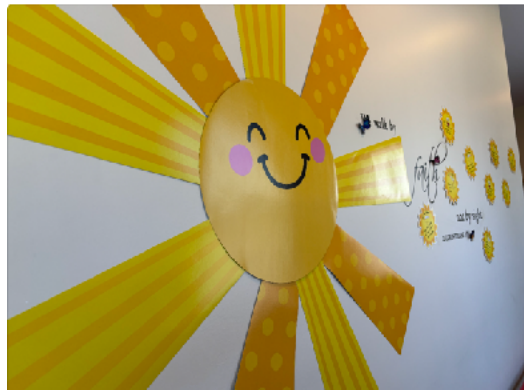

He was active member of First Presbyterian Church, The American Legion, International Union of Operating Engineers Local 68, AFL-CIO and the Vasa Order of America.

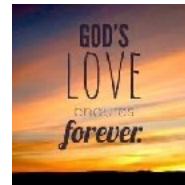
We at FPCH remember his devotion to assisting at the church whenever there was a need. He was active with our men's breakfast group, the

MEET OUR BEAUTIFUL PIPE ORGAN

So many who come into our church (and have been coming in for years!) immediately notice the stately gold pipes in front of the sanctuary. I'd like to share some information about our organ.

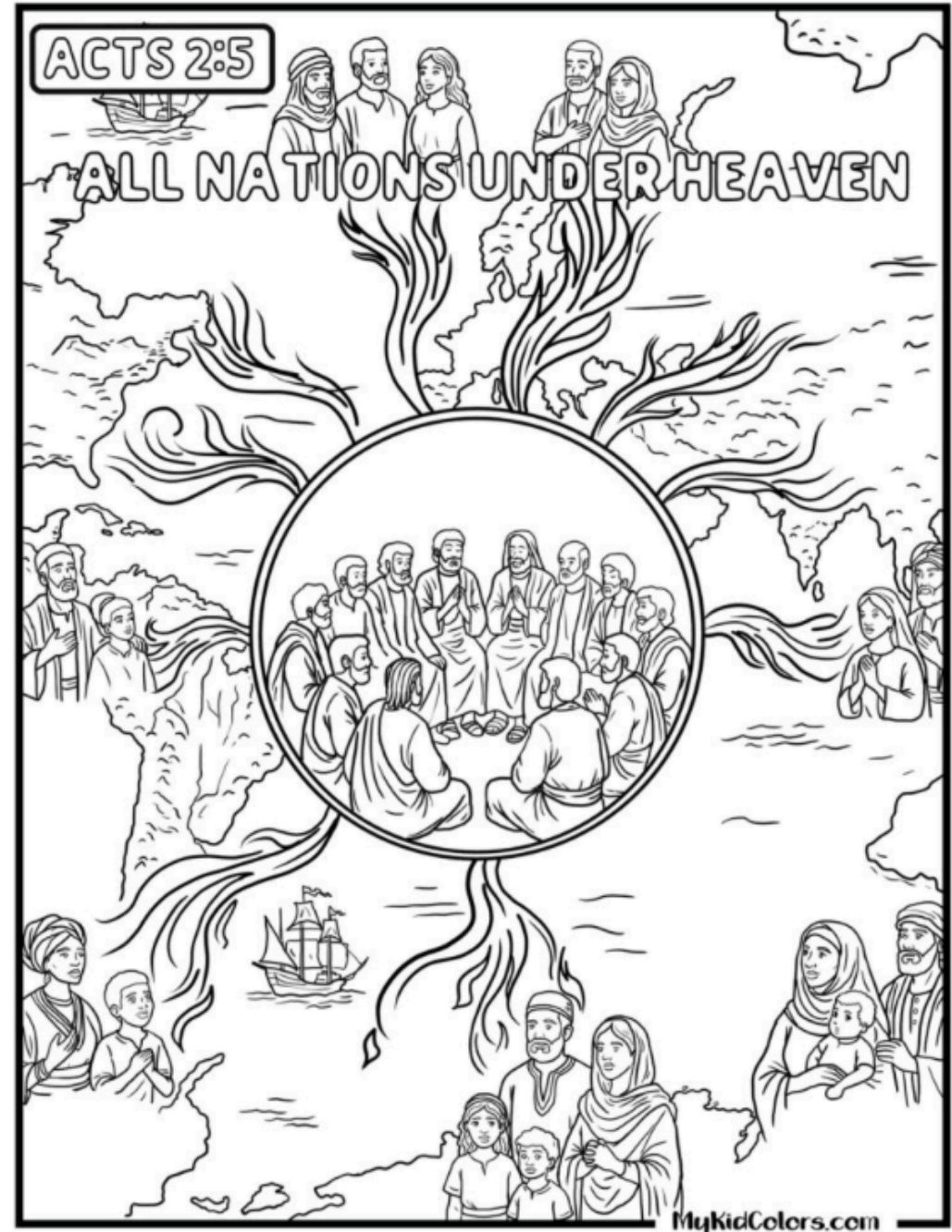
Our sanctuary has one of the few pipe organs in the county. Built in 1962 by the highly regarded Moller Company of Hagerstown, Maryland, it was established as a memorial to Mrs. Nellie Crane Alford who had passed away on May 29, 1959, when her son, Mr. William J. Alford contacted the Board of Deacons with a view to establishing a suitable memorial for his beloved mother. The matter was then referred to Session in May of 1960, and in June, Session approved the project with a bid of \$32,263 from the Moller Company. Were we to purchase it today, that \$32,263 is estimated to cost \$356,260. The organ was installed in November of 1962, and was the 9,630th pipe organ produced by the Moller Company.

Not many know, but the pipes that so beautifully grace the sanctuary are non-sounding pipes. They are decorative, and the real pipes are located in a chamber on the landing between the office level of the church and Heaven Sent Nursery School. Two screens allow the sound to be heard: one opening to the front of the sanctuary (nearest to the Jesus and the Children stained glass window), and one opening to the choir loft.

The air compressor that provides the necessary air for the pipes is located in a closet at the bottom of the steps to the downstairs youth room-the stairs by the parking lot door to the church.

Our organ has 3 manuals (keyboards) to be played by the organist's hands, and a full pedalboard played by her feet, called the Pedal Organ. It has 20 ranks of pipes and a full set of chimes as well. In all, there are hundreds and hundreds of pipes ranging from the size of a small pencil to the very large pipes that create the sounds for the pedals. On any given Sunday, all three manuals and the pedals are used throughout our service. The organ is serviced 4 times a year by the RW Kurtz Organ Company-in fact, if you go to their Facebook page, you'll see the pipes from our organ with the lighted Christmas wreath on them!

If anyone has questions or would like to see the working parts of the organ - the air compressor, the pipes, or the instrument itself - or would like to take a turn playing it, please ask me! I love showing off our beautiful instrument. In keeping with letting people know about the beauty and challenges of playing a pipe organ, as opposed to an electronic organ, on May 14, members of a Hackettstown High School piano class are coming to our church on a "field trip" to learn about and try playing our instrument.

Sharing God's Bounty

God's Draft Choices

Two of the most highly watched sporting events on television are not when teams or athletes are competing against each other; rather they involve the drafting of players for the National Football League (NFL) and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams. For many hours, fans of professional sports will watch intently to see whom their favorite teams will draft.

Most of us won't be drafted by professional football or basketball teams, but, as Christians, we receive a greater calling. We, in essence, are God's draft choices. "You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit" (John 15:16). God has made us a part of his team. We are not chosen by God because we are successful in our careers, great athletes, or wealthy. God chooses ordinary people to do extra-ordinary things. "But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong. He chose the lowly things of this world and the despised things ... and the things that are not ... to nullify the things that are" (1 Corinthians 1:27-28).

Through faith, we understand that we are among the foolish and weak through whom God carries on his life-saving work. "But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us" (2 Corinthians 4:7). God entrusts us ... clay jars ... with this treasure ... the Gospel. Even though we are frail and unworthy of our tasks, God has chosen us to carry his message of love to the world. As humble people of faith, we are empowered by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. He transforms and molds us. "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!" (2 Corinthians 5:17). It is God who does the drafting and the changing. Through faith, we will stay on God's team, and we will bear the fruit that he calls us to bear.

The professional athletes who are drafted are expected to perform. They are paid large sums of money to do very athletic things. As God's chosen people, we may not receive large compensation, but our benefits are out of this world! Therefore, we are eager to use our lives and resources in God's service for his glory. Paul wrote, "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:10). What a privilege it is to be part of and serving on God's winning team!

If Jesus walked up to you and said: "Come follow me ... I have a lot of work to do and I really need your help," would you tell him to get lost because you are just too busy in your pursuit of personal possessions and worldly comfort? Every day is a time to reflect on all that God has given you and a time to share and care about others. Have you given any consideration to helping Jesus carry out his works in your own church?

Pentecost and the Pentecost Offering

Pentecost

- Pentecost is from the Greek word “pentekoste which means 50th
- Pentecost is the 50th day after Easter (well actually it is the seventh Sunday after Easter which makes it 49 days but who’s counting?)
- This year, Pentecost is celebrated on Sunday, May 24, 2026
- In the Old Testament, “Pentecost referred to the Feast of Weeks (Leviticus 23:15; Deuteronomy 16:9) which celebrated the grain harvest (Shavuot in Hebrew) 50 days after Passover
- In the New Testament, Mary, the Apostles, and followers of Jesus were all in one place to celebrate the Weeks and the Holy Spirit descended upon them (Acts 2:1-3)

Pentecost Offering

- A special offering is collected on Pentecost
- Did You Know that 40% of that offering is used by FPCH to fund financial support for the younger members of our congregation to take part in activities at Johnsonburg Camp and Retreat Center
