CALL TO ORDER & WELCOME

In Attendance: Tom Mattingly, Teresa Hansen, John Scafe, Nate Finley and James Allen.

Also in attendance: City Clerk Stegelmeier, Skylar Davies (via Zoom), Taci Stoddard, Moriah Maupin and Ridge Maupin.

Mayor Mattingly welcomed everyone and opened the meeting at 6:00 pm.

1. **PARKS GRANT DISCUSSION – City Clerk Stegelmeier, Michele Smith, Taci Stoddard, Skylar Davies** **ACTION ITEM**

City Clerk Stegelmeier reported that she and Parks Supervisor Michele Smith met on the phone with Skylar Davies at Mastercraft Pool & Spa. They explained the items that were needed and he sent the information back and it is in the packet. City Clerk Stegelmeier explained that the bid bond and payment bond were not in the bid documents but that Mastercraft would get them but it would add \$7,500 to the bid. Councilman Allen explained that where the City has worked with them many years and they have a good reputation, he would feel comfortable going ahead without the bonds. The other council members agreed. Taci Stoddard explained that the only concern with the bid & contract is that the tile may not fit the BABA (Build America, Buy American) requirements. Skylar Davies with Mastercraft Pool and Spa explained that he will find a material that would fit the requirement but it may cost more. Councilman Scafe would like to get the project started so that it can be completed this year. Taci Stoddard explained to the Council that the bid for both the pool and street portions of the project was a little higher than anticipated so the City will need another \$20,000. She will discuss this with Dennis Porter at the Idaho Department of Commerce to see if there is a possibility of more grant money. Councilman Allen asked how long a period the City should expect a typical warrantee should be on this kind of work. Taci Stoddard explained it is typically one year like Mastercraft is offering.

Councilman Allen made a motion to accept the bid for the Pool Project from Mastercraft Pool and Spa. Councilman Finley seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

2. **WATER/SEWER SERVICES AT 74 N. 5TH STREET – City Clerk Stegelmeier, Deputy Clerk Vega, Ridge Maupin** **ACTION ITEM**

City Clerk Stegelmeier explained to the Council that there is a large bill owing at this address. The water had been turned off for non-payment back when Dan Maupin owned the building and had not paid the bill. His son Ridge is now hoping to use the building. She reminded them about the base rates and the need to make sure that each customer pays their share of the system. Ridge Maupin is here to discuss an overdue bill on the property at 74 N. 5th Street. He explained that he does not want to fight with the City or anything. He is hoping for a fair review of the account so that he can get an account set up for himself. He

had not been ignoring a bill, he did not know there was one owing. He went on to explain his thoughts on the situation to the Council. City Clerk Stegelmeier will get more information concerning the questions Ridge has and the Council will discuss it at the next meeting.

Councilwoman Hansen made a motion to adjourn. Councilman Finley seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
