
Old man winter will undoubtedly appear this year so let's be prepared for winter road conditions and low temperatures. It's important to have blankets, warm coats, flares, a shovel, snacks that won't spoil tions are slick or snowy. Give (granola bars), a first aid kit, a cell phone charger, and water in your vehicle just in case you tering intersections. Please are stranded. Remember to check weather conditions between destinations. With our winter conditions you could be stranded close to your home with no help so please be prepared. Do not drive around "road closed" gates and signs. If you get stranded

and require help you may be risking the first responder's safety as well as your own. Disobeying road closure signs is a criminal act. Drive safe and slow down when condiyourself ample time for braking, stopping, turning, and enwatch for pedestrians at the crosswalks. Please be cautious driving the back streets and watch for children playing in the snow. The speed limit on all of our back streets is 20 MPH but drive for current conditions. If you are leaving town this

winter for warmer weather, please be sure the doors on your home and outbuildings are locked. If you are leaving for an extended period of time, you may contact our office and ask for our department to keep an eye on your property.


