

Water Saving Tips

Some water saving tips for lawn care:

Automatic timers save water. With or without a home irrigation system, make sure you're getting the most out of your timer. Auto-



matic, programmable timers save more water than mechanical models. If you use a hose and portable sprinkler, you can purchase a hose end timer to regulate your watering time.

- Water in the evening or early morning to avoid evaporation. With a timer, you can set watering times even in the middle of the night!.
- Raise the blade on your lawn mower. Closely cropped grass requires more water.
 - Recycle your grass clippings back into your lawn by using a mulching mower. You'll not only conserve water, you'll save time while mowing.

Summer Mosquito Abatement

Throughout this summer, the City of Ashton will be conducting a mosquito abatement program. The City is using a machine that provides Ultra-Low-Volume (ULV) spraying. ULV spraying is the process of distributing very small amounts of liquid into the air as a fine mist droplet. Less than a "shot glass" of mosquito spray is dispersed over an area the size of a football field (approx. 1 acre). The droplets float over the air currents and quickly reduce the number of mosquitoes that come in contact with them. The spray the City is using is Pursuit 4-4 and information on it is available at the City Building.

Community members can assist the City with the mosquito abatement program by accomplishing two maintenance chores at their homes. The first is to keep the grass trimmed. Long grass can be a nice area for mosquitoes to live and breed. The second is to check your yard for any item with standing water sitting in it. This could be an old tire or even a low spot that gets too much water. Water is essential for mosquitoes so removing items that collect it or watering less will assist in keeping the mosquito population down.

The City will be fogging in the evening when the mosquitoes are actively flying, typically around dusk. The wind speed needs to be slow and so there will be evenings when no fogging will occur. The City Office has had inquiries as to 'opting out' of the mosquito fogging. As the fog is carried by air currents it is not realistic to stop the fog

as it will drift anyway. If you are concerned or want to 'opt out' - simply watch the weather conditions close to dusk. If it is a calm evening - the City will be fogging and you should stay inside your home with the windows closed. You can reopen the windows, etc. within the

hour.

The Independence Day celebration will again include a parade and activities in the city park. We will be closing Main Street for the parade and detouring traffic to Idaho Street. Detour signs will be posted with traffic direction. When leaving the parade by vehicle please use the back streets. If you attend the city park activities, please park off of the street as to not block a lane of traffic.

We continue to receive complaints and respond to illegal fireworks being used in the city limits. Basically, if it flies, it is illegal and cannot be purchased in Idaho unless you acquire a permit through the state of Idaho. Even with a permit those types of fireworks cannot legally be used in the city limits of Ashton and will not be allowed.

There will be no fireworks permits allowed in the city limits of Ashton. Firecrackers are illegal in the state of Idaho as well as within the city limits. Because of the number of complaints and the fact that sound easily carries throughout the town, we will respond to complaints and your illegal fireworks may be confiscated. You may receive one verbal

warning to stop the use of those fireworks. If you continue to launch illegal fireworks after the verbal warning you will be cited for disturbing the peace, a misdemeanor crime. Please remember we have an assisted living center in Ashton where occupants are aged and in bed early. Please don't spend your money on expensive fireworks just to have our department confiscate and destroy them.

The North Fremont Fire Department and Chamber of Commerce have a great firework display free to the public so please support them and their fundraiser.

Yard of the Month


Summer is here and that means that the City of Ashton's Yard of the Month is back!!.
