Public Hearings



A public hearing is a legally–required opportunity for the public to hear and respond to a request by a petitioner.

Such hearings are conducted in accordance with Idaho and Municipal Codes in a pre-set format. Dependent upon the request at hand, hearings may occur before the Planning & Zoning or the City Council. The

body may act in a quasi-judicial capacity; requests against duly enacted laws and standards OR may be simply processing legislative requests, such as in processing a code amendment.

Hearings are recorded and later transcribed into official minutes which can be obtained at the City of Ashton City Business Office. Past minutes are available on the City's

website at www.cityofashton.com. Written submissions are also included in the official records.

There is a brochure available at the City Building that explains the procedure more and gives direction for those wishing to comment at the meeting. Please contact the City Building at 652-3987 to get a copy or ask questions.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that at or about 7:00 PM on the 12th day of April, 2017, in the City Council Chambers, 714 Main Street, Ashton, Idaho, the City Council of the City of Ashton, Idaho, will hold a public hearing to consider the following matter:

1. A partial vacation of the Johnson Subdivision – vacating the public road (100 East – presently unbuilt) and lots 9-16 (8-lots). ACH Holdings, LLC/ Michael Chen of 1603 Wynview Lane, South Jordan, UT 84095, is the applicant.
 - The Ashton Planning & Zoning Commission has recommended that the City Council deny the request.

The purpose of the public hearing is so that the Council may receive public comments and testimony pertaining to this application. A copy of each application is available for public review at the Ashton City Building located at 714 Main Street, Ashton, Idaho. **THE PUBLIC IS INVITED TO ATTEND, AND PUBLIC COMMENT IS ENCOURAGED.** Written comments will be accepted and considered if received in the Ashton City Clerk's Office, 714 Main Street, Ashton, ID, no later than five (5) working days prior to the meeting; written comments not received by that date will need to be presented at the public hearing in order to be considered.

Any person needing special accommodations to participate in the meeting should contact the Ashton City Clerk's Office seven (7) days prior to the public hearing meeting.

4. The vast number of people who will access to it from nearby large cities.-astronomy.com


In East Idaho—local governments like the City of Ashton have been meeting to make sure that we can be prepared for the large amount of people who are expected to travel to our area to view the eclipse. It is hard to estimate how many visitors will show up to view the eclipse. Because East Idaho is listed as the second best viewing location in the USA and then add to that the proximity to Yellowstone Park it is likely that many visitors will try to come for the eclipse—then visit Yellowstone.

The Mayor, City Council, City Police and staff are encouraging Ashton citizens to be prepared. Here in Ashton we are used to being prepared for a large blizzard in the winter. The forecasted eclipse crowd is just a blizzard of people so we can use the same skills we already use. There may be enough traffic that you will need to leave earlier for work just as you would if the road conditions were bliz-

zard-like. It may be hard to get to the stores because of traffic or the stores may not have enough of the items you want/need. Please stock up on items such as diapers, milk or medications just as you would if a blizzard was in the forecast.

Although the eclipse is on Monday, August 21st, many eclipse watchers will be starting to get to their location as early as August 15th and may be here until August 23rd.

The eclipse crowd may be up to a two week blizzard so be prepared!
