ICC GR and Center of Focus teams assist 13 applications seeking RECI funding opportunities

The ICC Center of Focus and Government Relations team members assisted the development of 13 individual applications across 14 states for the U.S. Department of Energy's Resilient and Efficient Codes Implementation (RECI) funding opportunity. This support is led by Energy and Resilience Project Manager Stella Carr who has been working states and other partners to support project development for the concept paper phase. The team is engaged with states across the country and managing two project proposals that ICC is leading. Project topics range from innovative approaches to enforcement on a regional level to seeking support for energy code training for their state. Once we receive feedback on the concept papers, we'll be reaching out to applicants for support letters and additional detail required for the full applications, which are due in late March. This funding round is the first of five, and ICC is interested in connecting with you to develop future applications for next year's cycle as well as support other projects as they develop. New guide explores the coordinated approach of energy codes and Building Performance Standards
The International Code Council has released a new guide titled, "Energy Codes and Building
Performance Standards: Supporting Energy Use and Emissions Reductions in Buildings." This guide is

available to building code departments and code officials who want to understand how Building Performance Standards are developed and implemented. The guide focuses on the importance of a coordinated approach between code officials and energy policymakers where Building Performance Standards are adopted. Read more here.

Call for Committee: Two new codes and standards committees post application deadlines of March 15 The International Code Council is currently seeking code officials, design professionals, contractors, engineers, government officials, manufacturers, installers and other industry stakeholders to volunteer for two new Code Council committees to help develop new standards.

- The Foam Plastic Insulation Standard Committee (IS-FPI) As an ANSI-accredited standards developing organization, the Code Council is revising ICC 1100, Standard for Spray-applied Polyurethane Foam Plastic Insulation, to maintain the standard with current industry practice. Once appointed, this committee will convene to undergo the revision process in accordance with the Code Council's ANSI Approved Consensus Procedures and the ANSI Essential Requirements for the development of American National Standards.
- The 3D Automated Construction Technology for 3D Concrete Walls Consensus Committee (IS-3DACT) Once appointed, this committee will convene to develop the new ICC 1150 Standard for 3D Automated Construction Technology for 3D Concrete Walls to establish minimum requirements for the evaluation of the structural performance of 3D concrete walls and proprietary concrete wall-to-floor connections designed in accordance with applicable building codes, including material and durability properties of proprietary 3D Concrete. ICC joins FEMA's Mitigation Assessment Team in reviewing Hurricane Ian impacts in Florida
Karl Fippinger, Vice President of Fire and Disaster Mitigation of ICC Government Relations Department, recently joined federal, state and other officials at Fort Myers, Florida as part of a FEMA Mitigation
Assessment Team to understand how the built environment withstood the battering wind, waves and flooding of Hurricane Ian. Fippinger <u>produced this video</u> in which he shares an example of how a renovated older structure (originally built in 1946) compares to post-2020 construction. A report will be published for FEMA in approximately 12 months in conjunction with federal, state, and private-sector partners. Lessons learned from FEMA MAT reports frequently lead to proposals to improve the I-Codes. The Guardian Secure Proctoring Browser has multiple benefits including improved accessibility and ease-of-use that will decrease the need for individual technical support. January was National Mentoring Month but mentoring is a yearlong focus for Code Council members. This Building Safety Journal was published earlier this week highlighting January as National Mentoring Month. For Code Council members, it's a 12-month a year tradition to recruit and support young professionals who've chosen code enforcement careers. "My building safety mentor is Dwayne Garriss. Dwayne was the Georgia State Fire Marshal and President of the International Code Council Board of Directors when I first became a building official in 2016," said John "JC" Hudgison, who is now Chief Building Official for Tampa, Florida. "This type of mentor is a rare find and I am honored that Dwayne has chosen to continue to foster this relationship. My mentorship experience has inspired me to help by mentoring others who are looking to join the building safety industry." Hudgison is also Chair of the ICC Emerging Leaders Membership Council which promotes mentorship with its annual Trailblazer Award. As part of its research and strategy development process, HUD, with the assistance of the National Institute of Building Sciences and MOD X, is organizing a series of educational exchanges with off-site construction leaders from the United States, United Kingdom, Japan and Sweden to foster greater learning opportunities within the industry. Edition of ICC-PMG's CodeNotes™ address code provisions involving water heater installations

A residential water heater can be highly problematic if not installed correctly or maintained properly. A water heater temperature and pressure relief valve is an important safety device for water heaters as well as the water distribution system to which it is connected. Any water discharge from the relief valve is an indication of an underlying problem. This CodeNotes™ addresses the important code provisions associated with the relief valve. These items are mentioned in Section 504.6 of the 2021 IPC and Section P2804.6.1 of the 2021 IRC. Read more here.
