

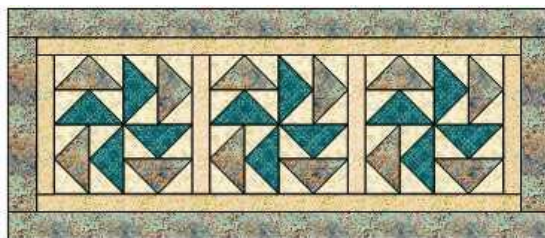

Dutchman's Puzzle Table Runner

Honk! Honk! You spoke & I listened! At our July meeting, the group said that they would like to work on a different project each month and develop skill building. So here is our project for our August club meeting. Can you guess? Honk! Honk! We are going to work on flying geese blocks! Let's learn three different methods for making flying geese. Once you've tried all three, you can decide which method works the best for you. We'll put our flying geese into a traditional block called Dutchman's Puzzle. Can you see the "windmill blades" created by the darker color placement? This project would look spectacular in a wide array of fabrics, including fall colors, batiks, or holiday.

Here's what you will need:

| B | Dark for "pinwheel" geese | 1/3 yard or (1) fat quarter | (2) 10" squares (4) 3 1/2 x 6 1/2 " rectangles |
| C | Medium for outer geese and border #2 | 2/3 yard | (2) 10" squares (4) 3 1/2 x 6 1/2 " rectangles |
| D | Sashing and border #1 | 1/3 yard or 1 fat quarter | |
| E | Binding | 1/3 yard or 1 fat quarter | |
