What is WRaPParound?

WRaPParound - Writing, Reading and Performance Poetry

Set up in 2013, **WRaPParound** is a JCSP Library Project performance poetry initiative run in conjunction with Poetry Ireland and Trócaire. Participating students in each school work with an established poet/rapper over a full day or over a series of shorter workshops during which they write, edit, recite and/or record their own work.

This spoken-word poetry initiative introduces students to writing, reading and reciting poetry in a new way. Through being encouraged to craft poems based on their own ideas and experiences, students find a new way into poetry.

Writing, listening to and creating spoken word poetry and rap songs gives students an understanding of the power of language. The ability to write their own poems, to stand up and perform their poems or to rap quickly and clearly contributes to the development of writing, oral language and listening skills.

WRaPParound 2016/2017

A total of 27 schools and over 400 students from around the country took part in the 2016/2017 initiative which culminated in *WRaPParound Wrap* celebration events which took place in University College Cork on the 27th April and in Trinity College Dublin on the 47th April and in Trinity College Dublin on the 47th April and in Trinity College Dublin on the 47th April and in Trinity College Dublin on the 47th April and in Trinity College Dublin on the 37th April 2017. These celebratory events involved the coming together of a selection of students from across the participating schools, who got up on stage and performed their poems/raps to a large audience, did both themselves and their schools proud. An added bonus this year was that participating school groups were invited to take guided campus tours following the WRaPParound event - facilitated by UCC+ in UCC and TAP/College Aware in TCD.

Through the support of Trócaire's Mobilising for Justice Scheme, we were delighted to introduce the WRaPParound the World strand to the initiative. Under this strand a selection of schools received grant aid to engage a poet/performance artist to work with their students to produce poems and raps on the chosen Trócaire theme. This year's theme was 'Before the Flood' (Climate justice, Human rights, etc.)

This was the sixth year of the WRAPParound initiative. Experience to date has demonstrated that participation in this spoken word poetry education initiative can strengthen students' literacy skills, can engage reluctant writers and can develop the student voice and emotional literacy. The very real impact of the initiative on student engagement with their learning and on their confidence and self-belief has been evident throughout.

So, movie buffs! Meady for a wild ride with "The Little Gang"? Here's the scoop on this cool film...

"The Little Gang" (La petite bande) is a 2022 French comedy drama that runs for 100 minutes. Set and shot in France, it revolves around four young activists aiming to stop a local factory from polluting their water supply and promoting awareness about climate change. The film takes an unexpected turn when their late-night attack on the factory doesn't go as planned. Despite their actions, the audience finds themselves rooting for these mini climate activists. Pierre Salvadori, the master of clever comedies, brings us a fresh and inventive movie about a group of preteens turned eco-warriors. Imagine a gang of 12-year-olds on a mission to save nature - sounds crazy, right? Set in a small town in Corsica during a sunny summer, our four heroes - Fouad, Antoine, Cat, and Sami - get inspired after a class presentation on pollution. The town's river is off-limits due to a nasty factory, so they decide to take matters into their own hands. Their plan? To set fire to the factory. But, of course, things don't go as smoothly as they hope.

What unfolds is a hilarious adventure filled with unexpected twists, including a surprise appearance by the factory boss and a new member joining their "Green Ninjas" crew. As the gang faces challenges, their bond is put to the test. Perfectly cast with diverse personalities, "The Little Gang" gives us a peek into the lives of five different kids - from the son of a cop to the son of a convict, and more. It's a classic adventure with cabins, binoculars, kayaks, bikes, and even secret romances. This film isn't just about laughs; it's a tale of friendship, bravery, and standing up against environmental harm. Pierre Salvadori weaves a magical story that's both heartwarming and eco-friendly.





SCHOOL BASED STATEMENTS



These statements should be sent to the JCSP office for approvalprior to being used. Please email statements to jcsp@pdst.ie.


