



Armored Doors Didn't Make a Difference

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Unprovoked attacks on police officers are rising. California Deputy Robert Riggs saw it firsthand when his partner was ambushed in his patrol car. Despite having armored door panels, most of the shots were through the windows and he sustained wounds to his hand and upper body when he tried to protect his face. Riggs has since patented and manufactures Riggs Shield – the fastest deploying ballistic shield - which mounts to the inside of a patrol car door.
