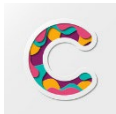

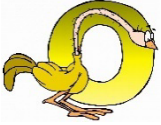

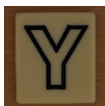

Other Frequently Used Terms:

Custodial Parent: The person with physical custody or with whom the child lives. This can be a parent, a relative or someone else.

Family Driven: Means families have a primary decision-making role in the care of their own children as well as the policies and procedures governing care for all children in their community, state, tribe, territory, and nation.

NC Medicaid: The agency within DHHS that is responsible for the administration of the state medical assistance program, or Medicaid. Previously known as DMA or DIV of Medical Assistance.

Resource Parents: Refers to foster, adoptive, therapeutic foster care parents, or kinship caregivers.

Young Adult: Adult between 18 & 26.

Youth Guided: Means that young people have the right to be empowered, educated, and given a decision-making role in the care of their own lives as well as the policies and procedures governing care for all youth in the community, state and nation. This includes giving young people a voice and then listening to that voice.
