We all know what the upside is (overall QB1), but I am mainly concerned with the downside which is "September-October season ending injury with a possible Verizon remote control-sized hole through my LG television." Lawrence is now in year 3, surrounded with talent and plays in a division that gives up more points than a republican candidate during the mail-in voting registration cycle. Russell Wilson is probably the league's best QB3 and my team he's gratuitous with what I have in front of him. Overall Grade: A

RB: JK Dobbins, Ken Walker, David Montgomery, Devon Achane: While it wasn't the initial plan, circumstances had me punt the position until the mid-rounds and it shows with no clear RB1 on the roster. Still, Dobbins and Walker, have the ability to be strong mid to high RB2s and if Montgomery gets

the Jamal Williams treatment in Detroit, he could also finish in that zone. I got a little lucky with Achane as he avoided the Jonathan Taylor death blow, but even if Miami revisits that trade in a couple of weeks it may be Achane heading to Indy to play a prominent role in that backfield. I don't love the group, but it's also probably better than most of you think:

Overall Grade: B-

WR: Justin Jefferson, Amon-Ra St. Brown, Elijah Moore, Treyton Burks, Romeo Doubs, Marvin Mims: Jefferson is the favorite to land as League WR1 and St. Brown, himself is a fantasy WR1 playing WR2 on my team. This duo easily bests any other in the league, but the potential problem lies with what to do at WR3. Moore, Burks, and Doubs will all start for their teams and it's not out of the realm of possibility that at least one of them will leave this season as its team's top target. I seem to like Marvin Mims more than most, but before you bury him, consider that he's the only player catching passes in Denver that the current regime selected and so long as Jerry Jeudy is out, he should be heavily targeted. That's not bad for a WR7. Obviously, this group is stacked, but I must deduct half a letter grade due to the uncertainty of who to play at WR3 on a weekly basis:

Overall Grade: A-

TE: Darrin Waller: It's a little scary relying so heavily on Waller, but he's the only TE in football not named Travis Kelce that is his team's consensus #1 target, and that includes Marc Andrews. He's healthy, motivated, and everyone reading this would blow his quarterback if he asked them to. What's not to like?

Overall Grade: B+

What the Magic 8-Ball Tells Me: Although I'm posting my division first, this is actually the final write-up that I did. The running joke is that I get these reviews wrong, but the truth of the matter is, I do well each year with the notable exception of who I pick to be the league's best team.
