Taylor was a necessary stash and grab with limited options, but I'm not sure how good he would be in the unlikely event that he has to start. To put it bluntly, this QB situation is a huge problem.

Overall Grade: D+

RB: Derrick Henry, AJ Dillon, D'Andre Swift, Deuce Vaughn: Tom's making it very hard to implement the compliment sandwich approach, but I'll Try (at least with the first 3): Henry is about as consistent as it gets but it's hard to expect him to be anything other than a mid to low-end RB1. AJ Dillon is not only a good #2 on a fantasy roster, but he may also not be a good #2 on his own team in Green Bay. Swift has high upside as a RB3. If the Eagles use him the way Detroit should have, he'll represent the upside piece of this group. I get the hype around Deuce Vaughn, but only sort of. He's shifty, works hard and even somehow managed to block during the preseason, but that was the preseason. Once the season begins, the reality will set in and that reality is that the dude is 5 ft 5 and 175 pounds. I don't even bother trying to match with girls on Hinge that are smaller than that.

Overall Grade: C+

WR: Deebo Samuel, Terry McLaurin, Tyler Locket, Tyler Boyd, Paris Campbell, Jalin Hyatt: Once again, Tom is a little light as Deebo makes a much better WR2 than he does a WR1. I have no issues with Terry as a WR2 and Locket should overproduce as a WR3. I don't hate Boyd as a WR4 and would absolutely love him if anything happened to either Chase, or Higgins. Parris Campbell has a lot of upside and Jalin Hyatt is a great hedge should something happen to him

Overall Grade: B

TE: Travis Kelce, Mark Andrews I had to rewrite the review with the Kelce injury, but I must admit, that this doesn't make any sense to me. My only comment here is that when you trade one of these guys, Tom, just please don't ruin the competitive balance of the league by giving them away in an awful trade: Before the Kelce Injury, the grade was a A+++, but I had to knock it down a bit due to his uncertainty.
