Run order will be drawn prior to the trials; a wait list will be kept. Bitches in season will run in order. Substitution of owner's dog allowed if entry of another dog is pulled. Sheep will be Coop crosses, Cattle are beef cattle, Ducks are various cross breeds.

*Most Promising Started Aussie and Other Breed are determined by the four highest combined qualifying scores from a minimum of two different classes of started stock (sheep/cattle/ducks). Ties are broken by the highest cattle score, if there are no qualifying cattle scores, then by the highest sheep score.

From I5 take the Old Nisqually exit 116 and get on Old Pacific Hwy until it ends• Turn LEFTonto Hwy 510

in 1/2 mile turn RIGHT onto Meridian and follow it to the stop sign at Yelm Hwy• Continue straight ahead south on Meridian through a left turn and a right turn • When you see the 20 mphleft turn sign turn LEFT onto Evergreen Valley Rd • It is less than 1/2 mile on your RIGHT.

Take exit 101 from I5• Go east (right) on Tumwater Blvd. Stay on it until it ends.• Turn left onto Henderson Blvd• At the stop light turn right onto Yelm Highway -- follow it east about 7 miles• At the 76 station turn RIGHT onto Meridian and follow it south through a left turn and aright turn • When you see the 20 mph left turn sign turn LEFT onto Evergreen Valley Rd• It is less than ½ mile on your RIGHT



Twenty minutes with two warnings, one at 10 minutes and one at 5 minutes. All gates must be closed before course time ends. Dog must hold sheep off of all gates.

- 1. Pasture work #1-2 (40 pts.) Time starts when the gate from Chicken Field into the Ewe Lane is opened. Gather 10 sheep from Ewe Lane into Chicken Field. Drive or fetch them through the gate in the middle of field.
- 2. PEN WORK #3-7 (25 pts.) Take sheep through Test Arena, into Round Corral, into Big Arena, into Pen A, into Pen B, into Crowding Alley.
- 3. CHUTE #8-9 (20 pts.) Load sheep into the Chute. Close guillotine behind the last sheep. Move all sheep through the Chute into Pen C. Time ends when Swinging Gate is closed into Pen A.
- 4. SORT #10-11 (15 pts.) Move sheep from Pen C into Pen A. Gate Sort 5 sheep into West Barn Yard. Close gate. Open gate and put the remaining 5 sheep into West Barn Yard. Time ends when the gate is closed.
