Day of entries added on must pay day of entry fees. No refunds will be made if the show/trial cannot open due to riots, civil disturbances, acts of God, public emergencies or other events beyond the control of the ASC of WA. No entry shall be accepted from a dog or handler if they are disqualified from that ASCA program(s); or a person not in good standing with ASCA. All events will be held under the current rules and regulations of ASCA. Entries must be on an official ASCA form with the agreement signed. Information must be complete, legible and indicate the date of show(s). Entry forms for each event may have all the days entries on one form. No mail will be accepted without waiver of signature and will be returned if this is not done. Entry fees may be refunded if an owner presents show committee with a letter from a veterinarian stating the entry should not participate due to health reasons. These refunds must be requested prior to start of the show. \$20.00 fee for any returned checks. Funds need to be in US dollars.

**DIVISIONS:** Started, Open, Advanced, Junior Handler, Novice Handler **RUNS** Sat/Sun: **2 trials each day** with 50 runs of cattle, sheep and ducks combined per Judge (note: number of entries on stock will be determined by how many stock are available) **NUMBER OF STOCK /RUN for arena trials:** ducks 5/run; sheep 3-5/run; cattle 3-5/run Sheep are mixed hair and wooly breeds, Cattle are beef, Ducks are cross breds

**POLICIES:** An official waiting list will be maintained. A draw for run order will be made prior to the trial. Entries can be withdrawn before the pre-entry date closes. If an owner pulls an entry after the close of entries no refund will be made unless that space can be filled from the waiting list, except for injured dogs (see entry paragraph above). Substitution of a dog owned or co-owned by the same owner is allowed. NOTE: Refunds will take time. Bitches in season shall run in order. Bitches in heat will be contained away from trial the area until their run. NOTE: Other breeds wishing to compete for ASCA titles must have an ASCA tracking number. This number can be applied for day of trial. Replacement cost for cattle: market value, sheep: \$200/head, ducks: \$25 per head.

From North or South I-5 to Hwy 16 in Tacoma. Hwy 16 begins at I-5 and travels toward Bremerton.

- Take Hwy 16 past Gig Harbor. Exit at sign for Hwy 302W (Purdy/Shelton).
- Follow exit road into Purdy to the traffic light
- Turn left at signal following sign for Hwy 302W (Shelton/Key Center) -- you will cross the Wauna Bridge.
- Continue to follow Hwy 302W (NOTE: At some point along here you will likely lose cell phone service.)

ASCA Farm Dog Trial - Cattle ASCA Farm Dog Trial August 2nd, 2024

## GENERAL RULES:

- Time 25 minutes. There will be a 10 minute and a 3 minute warning. A set out dog will not be used.
- In all elements, quiet efficient stock work is essential.
- All elements must be attempted prior to moving on.
- All gates may be open/closed or pre-set at the Handler's discretion to increase safety.
- Time will not end until all gates have been restored to their original/starting position.
- Ties are broken based on individual scores in the following order: Exercise 2 "Fence Obstacle", Exercise 5 "Pens", Time.

## STARTING SETUP:

- 5 cattle in P5 waiting for the Set-Out, 5 in Side Pen A, and 3 groups of 5 in the pens in Alley A/B
- 1. GATHER 20 pts.: The team will move to the location appropriate for their level. Exercise begins when the dog is sent. Gather the stock and move them toward the handler. Exercise ends when the stock has crossed the plane of the Handler's Post counter clock ways around the handler. Gather will be a minimum of 150'.
  - **Open** The dog will be positioned at the Handler's Post, Handler may move up half way to stock.
  - Advanced The dog and handler will be positioned at the Handler's Post.
- FENCE OBSTACLE 20 pts.: Exercise begins when the stock have passed the plane of the Handler's Post. The team shall move the stockto and through the Fence Obstacle. Exercise ends when all the stock have exited the Fence Obstacle.
  - **Open** The team shall move the stock straight through the Fence Obstacle exiting out the opposite end.
  - **Advanced** The team shall move the stock through the Fence Obstacle, exiting out the side gap.

**GATE SORT – 25 pts.:** Exercise begins when all the stock have exited the Fence Obstacle. The team shall move the stock to P1 where the team will gate sort 3 marked stock into P1. Briefly close the gate to P1 then pen the remaining stock.

4 **CHUTE** 20 pts.: Exercise begins when the stock have joined together in P1. The team shall pen the stock into the chute in the back alley as drawn on the diagram. The dog shall hold the stock in the obstacle while the handler calls out the ear tag number to the judge. The handler shall then open the closed end of the chute and remove the stock from the chute. Exercise ends when the stock has exited the chute via the gate into the Alley Pen and the gate is closed.


**PENS - 25** pts.: Exercise begins when cattle are penned in Alley Pen. Dog and Handler should pass through Alley Pen into P2. Move cattle from Side Pen A into empty pen in Alley C/D. Then move cattle from Alley Pen into Side Pen A. Then move cattle from designated pen in Alley C/D through P2 into Back Alley. When dog, handler, and all cattle are in Back Alley close gate between P2 and Back Alley. Exercise ends when gate between P2 and Back Alley is closed.

**FETCH/DRIVE - 20 pts.:** Exercise begins when the gate between P2 and Back Alley is closed. Fetch/drive the stock towards P5 past the Drive Marker. Exercise ends when the stock reaches the Drive Marker.

- **Open** Handler remains behind the Open Handler's Line while the stockis moved to the Drive Marker.
- **Advanced** Handler remains behind the Advanced Handler's Line while the stock is moved to the Drive Marker.



# 2024 Farm Dog Trial -Cattle ASC of WA



# **General Rules:**

- 25 minutes: 10 and 3 minute warning
- All tasks must be completed before moving on
- All gates may be open/closed at the Handler's discretion (unless specified); however, time will not end until all gates have been restored to their original/starting position.
- Tie Breaker, in the following order: Gather, Sort, Time

# **Starting Set Up:**

All gates are closed 5 ducks in Pen B 5 Sheep in Pen C, sets of 5 sheep in holding pens.

**1. Pen 1 - 5 points:** Start at the Duck Arena: Take Ducks out of Pen B. Starts when gate is opened and ends when the ducks are in the Duck Arena and gate is closed.

**2. Gather - 20 points:** Call dog off and move 75 feet to handler's cone to send dog. Starts when dog is called. Ends when ducks are gathered at the cone.

**ADVANCED:** dog and handler send from the post. **OPEN:** Dog starts from post. Handler can move 1/2 way to ducks

**3.** Chute - 20 points: After gather, move ducks through chute on fence  $(2 \times 8)$  and then open gate. Starts when ducks are gathered. Ends when ducks exit chute.

**4. Pen 2 - 5 points:** Take ducks to Pen A and pen them. Starts when ducks exit chute and ends when ducks are in Pen A.

**5. Pen 3 - 5 points:** Take ducks out of Pen A while handler closes the gate. Return ducks to Pen B. Place dog on leash, exit Duck Arena. Starts when gate opens. Ends when gate to Pen B closes. Move to Sheep Bottom Field. Unleash dog after entering Sheep Bottom Field at 100 x 100 arena gate.

6. Pen 4 – 5 points: Take Sheep out of Pen C and into  $100 \times 100$  pen Starts when pen is opened. Ends when sheep are in  $100 \times 100$  pen.

7. Sort – 25 points: Sort 3 marked sheep into the  $180 \times 140$  arena. Then put the remaining 2 sheep in with the 3 sheep. Starts when sheep are in the  $100 \times 100$  pen. Ends when all sheep are in the  $180 \times 140$  arena.


**8: Task 1: Ribbon pull – 20 points:** Remove ribbons from the sheep. Starts when the sheep are combined in the 180 x 140 arena. Ends when the ribbons are removed.

ADVANCED: Remove ribbons from 3 sheep OPEN: Remove ribbons from 2 sheep

9. Task 1 – 20 points: Move sheep to the gate of the round pen: Allow Sheep to go thru gate as prescribed.
 Starts once the ribbon pull is finished. Ends when sheep are in the round pen.
 ADVANCED: all sheep enter 1 at a time. OPEN: at least 3 sheep enter 1 at a time

10. Pen -5 points: Hold sheep against the fence while opening the gate to the exhaust pen. Starts when the sheep enter the round pen and ends when the sheep are in the exhaust pen
