Conformation: Non-regular: 2-4 mo, 4-6 mo Regular: 6-9 mo, 9-12 mo, 12-15 mo, 15-18 mo, Novice, American Bred, Bred By Exhibitor, Open Blue Merle, Open Red Merle, Open Black, Open Red, BOB – classes divided by sex. Altered first, then Intact.

MVA Evaluation Judge Lynn Hamon, time and place to be announced. ASC of WA ROM rules will be followed for computation of points (http://www.ascofwa.org/rom_rules.pdf) with the exception that Rally points can be used instead of Obedience points – whichever is higher (points to be scored the same as obedience). A QS is required in obedience or rally, stock and a passing score of 70% is required for the conformation evaluation.

Pre-entry: Regular \$12, non-regular \$8, Day of: Regular \$15, non-regular \$10

Obedience entries will be limited to a daily judging limit of 8 hours.

Bitches in season may compete at the end of the second trial. They must be crated at least 50' from obedience ring, wear pants and run last after all obedience judging is finished for legs and scores only.

POLICIES: Only regular classes are eligible for High Score Awards. Bitches in season will not be allowed to compete in Rally. Upon verification of being in heat by a veterinarian or the Obedience/Rally Committee, the entry fee will be refunded if wished. All Breeds may compete; however, they are required to have an ASCA Tracking number. This number may be applied for at the show. Owners/Handlers entering Novice Obedience/Rally who have titled a dog in any registry in Novice must enter Novice B. Any dog entering Novice or Open Obedience who has earned a CD or CDX in any registry must enter Novice B or Open B, as appropriate. Any dog entering Advanced or Excellent Rally who has earned a RA or RE or an equivalent title in any other registry, must enter Novice B, Advanced or Excellent Rally, as appropriate.

From Tacoma and Seattle

- From I5 take the Old Nisqually exit 116 and get on Old Pacific Hwy until it ends • Turn LEFT onto Hwy 510
- in 1/2 mile turn RIGHT onto Meridian and follow it to the stop sign at Yelm Hwy • Continue straight ahead south on Meridian through a left turn and a right turn • When you see the 20 mph left turn sign turn LEFT onto Evergreen Valley Rd • It is less than 1/2 mile on your RIGHT.

From Portland

- Take exit 101 from I5 • Go east (right) on Tumwater Blvd. Stay on it until it ends. • Turn left onto Henderson Blvd • At the stop light turn right onto Yelm Highway -- follow it east about 7 miles • At the 76 station turn RIGHT onto Meridian and follow it south through a left turn and a right turn • When you see the 20 mph left turn sign turn LEFT onto Evergreen Valley Rd • It is less than 1/2 mile on your RIGHT

Most Versatile Aussie rules are available at http://www.ascofwa.org/rom_rules.pdf All breeds can compete in the Stockdog trial, but to receive titles you must either have an ASCA registration number or an ASCA tracking number. All obedience entries must be registered with ASCA or have an ASCA tracking number to compete. All breeds can compete in Junior Handling, but all Juniors going for ASCA merit points must compete with an ASCA registered Aussie that meets ownership requirements and be a Junior member. All regular Aussie conformation entries must have an ASCA registration number. Tracking number applications will be available. No entry shall be accepted from a dog or handler if they are disqualified from that ASCA program(s); or a person not in good standing with ASCA. All events will be held under the current rules and regulations of ASCA

SITE:

Fido's Farm is a facility dedicated to dogs and their training. Arenas will be in pastures – if rainy, the ground can be wet, so bring boots. Junior Handling, Conformation, Obedience and Rally will be in a covered dirt arena. Set ups are allowed, camping available, contact Fido's Farms at 360-866-8347. The site is available from Thursday noon on. Dogs are to be on leash unless competing, you are expected to pick up after your dog.

ASC OF WA OLYMPIA DOG DAYS FARM DOG TRIAL

GENERAL RULES: Time: 25 minutes with a 10 minute and a 3 minute warning. All gates must be closed and latched unless otherwise stated before time stops. Dog must hold sheep off all gates. Ties are broken based on individual scores in the following order: Exercise 7 Drive/Wear", Exercise #9 Gate Sort, Time

STARTING SET-UP: 5 sheep in Big Arena, 5 Sheep in Corral A, 5 sheep in Holding Pen. All gates are shut and latched. All drop gates are down. A set out dog may be used.

1. GATHER (150 feet)– 20 points: Time starts when dog is sent from Cone A. Gather sheep to Cone A. Move sheep into Holding Pen. Exercise ends when Holding Pen gate is closed with sheep and handler inside.

Open: Place dog at Cone A. Handler may move half way to sheep.

Advanced: Handler and dog work from Cone A.

2. Pen #1 – 5 points: Exercise starts when the gate to the Holding Pen is closed. Put the 10 head in Holding Pen into the Crowding Pen. Exercise ends when the gate is closed.

3. Pen #2 – 5 points: Release sheep from Corral A into Holding Pen and release into the Holding Alley. Exercise ends when the gate is closed.

4. Pen #3 – 10 points: Exercises begins when the Holding Alley gate is closed. Go into the Crowding Pen and load the 10 sheep into the Sheep Yard. Exercise ends when sheep and dog are in the Sheep Yard and gate is closed.

5. Chute work – 20 points: Exercise starts after the sheep and dog are in the Sheep Yard and the gate is closed. Load sheep into the chute. Put a ribbon on 4 sheep. Sort 5 non-ribboned sheep into Corral A and 4 ribboned sheep and 1 naked sheep into Corral B. Exercise ends when all sheep are in Corral B and both drop gates are down.

6. Pen #4 – 5 points: Remove the 5 sheep from Corral B.

7. DRIVE / WEAR – 20 points: Exercise begins when sheep are released from Corral B into Big Arena. Drive/wear sheep to Cone B, passing sheep counterclockwise between Cone B and fence, then through the poles, then to Cone C, passing between Cone C and the side fence. Exercise ends once sheep have passed Cone C.

Open: The handler may walk with sheep throughout.

Advanced: The handler must stay at Cone B until sheep reach the last pole.

8. RIBBON PULL – 20 points: Exercise begins when the last sheep passes between Cone C and fence. Bring the sheep to a space in the middle of the lower ¼ of the arena.

Open: Demonstrate a hold on the sheep

Advanced: Demonstrate a hold on the sheep and then remove 1 ribbon.

9. Gate sort – 25 points: Exercise starts after the hold and/or ribbon pull has been accomplished. Sort 3 sheep at the Barn Yard gate. Then combine the rest of the sheep into the Barn Yard. Exercise ends when all sheep are in the Barn Yard and the gate is closed.

Open: Can sort any 3 sheep. **Advanced:** Must sort off the 3 ribboned sheep
