ALL STOCKDOG ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED IN POSTMARK ORDER except that entries received more than 10 days after the postmark date will be accepted by receipt date. Day of entries added on must pay day of entry fees. No refunds will be made if the show/trial cannot open due to riots, civil disturbances, acts of God, public emergencies or other events beyond the control of the ASC of WA. No entry shall be accepted from a dog or handler if they are disqualified from that ASCA program(s); or a person not in good standing with ASCA. All events will be held under the current rules and regulations of ASCA. Entries must be on

an official ASCA form with the agreement signed. Information must be complete, legible and indicate the date of show(s). Entry forms for each event may have all the day's entries on one form. No mail will be accepted without waiver of signature and will be returned if this is not done. Entry fees may be refunded if an owner presents show committee with a letter from a veterinarian stating the entry should not participate due to health reasons. These refunds must be requested prior to start of the show. \$20.00 fee for any returned checks. Funds need to be in US dollars.

DIVISIONS: Started, Open, Advanced, Junior Handler, Novice Handler **RUNS Sat/Sun: 2 trials each day** with 50 runs of cattle, sheep and ducks combined per Judge (note: number of entries on stock will be determined by how many stock are available)

NUMBER OF STOCK /RUN for arena trials: ducks 5/run; sheep 3-5/run; cattle 3-5/run

Sheep are mixed hair and wooly breeds, Cattle are beef, Ducks are cross breeds

POLICIES: An official waiting list will be maintained. A draw for run order will be made prior to the trial. Entries can be withdrawn before the pre-entry date closes. If an owner pulls an entry after the close of entries no refund will be made unless that space can be filled from the waiting list, except for injured dogs (see entry paragraph above). Substitution of a dog owned or co-owned by the same owner is allowed. NOTE: Refunds will take time. Bitches in season shall run in order. Bitches in heat will be contained away from trial the area until their run. NOTE: Other breeds wishing to compete for ASCA titles must have an ASCA tracking number. This number can be applied for day of trial. Replacement cost for cattle: market value, sheep: \$200/head, ducks: \$25 per head.

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP and CONFORMATION

Order of classes - Juniors, Non-regular, Altered & Intact.

Saturday First Show: August 1st: Show Secretary: Margaret Cameron, **Judge Vicky Jo Graves**

Saturday Second Show: August 1st: Show Secretary: Margaret Cameron, **Judges: Wayne Bond**

Junior Classes: PeeWee (3-5 years), Sub-Junior (6-7 years), Novice & Open, to be divided by ages: 8-12 years & 13-17 years.

NOTE: Juniors may compete with any breed; however for ASCA points in the merit programs, the dog must be an Australian Shepherd and must meet ASCA Junior ownership requirements (rule book available at www.asca.org)

Conformation Classes (to be divided by sex):

Non-Regular: 2-4 month, 4-6 month, Movement Class

Altered & Intact: 6-9 mth, 9-12 mth, 12-15 mth, 15-18 mth, Novice, American Bred, Bred by Exhibitor,

Open Blue Merle, Open Red Merle, Open Black, Open Red, Best of Breed.

NOTE: ALL Australian Shepherds MUST have an individual ASCA registration number to compete, except non-regular puppies, who MUST BE ELIGIBLE for ASCA registration.

AWARDS: Ribbons 1st thru 4th place.

Stock: Farm Dog Trials: High Scoring in Farm Dog Trial. Arena trials: *Each trial:* High in Stockdog Trial Aussie, High in Stockdog Trial Other Breed. *Overall Trial:* High Combined Aussie, High Combined Other Breed, High Combined Ducks, High Combined Sheep, High Combined Cattle, High Scoring Started Aussie, High Scoring Started Other Breed, High Combined Junior.

Conformation/Junior Handling: Best Junior Handler, Reserve Junior Handler, Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Best of Winners, Winners Dog, Reserve Winners Dog, Winners Bitch, Reserve Winners Bitch, Best of Breed Puppy, Best of Opposite Sex Puppy each show

Directions to PackLeader Farm

From North or South I-5 to Hwy 16 in Tacoma. Hwy 16 begins at I-5 and travels toward Bremerton.

- Take Hwy 16 past Gig Harbor. **Exit** at sign for Hwy 302W (Purdy/Shelton).
- **Follow exit road** into Purdy to the traffic light
- **Turn left at signal** following sign for Hwy 302W (Shelton/Key Center) -- you will cross the Wauna Bridge.
- **Continue to follow Hwy 302W** (NOTE: At some point along here you will likely lose cell phone service.)
- **Turn right (turn lane-right turn only) onto Elgin-Clifton Rd** following sign for Hwy 302W (Shelton/Allyn)
- **Turn right onto 150th.** Intersection well marked with signs prior to and at corner.
- **Turn left on 1st road.** No street sign, but marked with a large sign on left that says Rocky Creek Conservation Area".
- **Follow road through the park.** When you exit the trees, there will be a green farm gate directly in front of you which is the entrance to the facility.

ASCA – FDT sheep – Lower Field

GENERAL RULES:

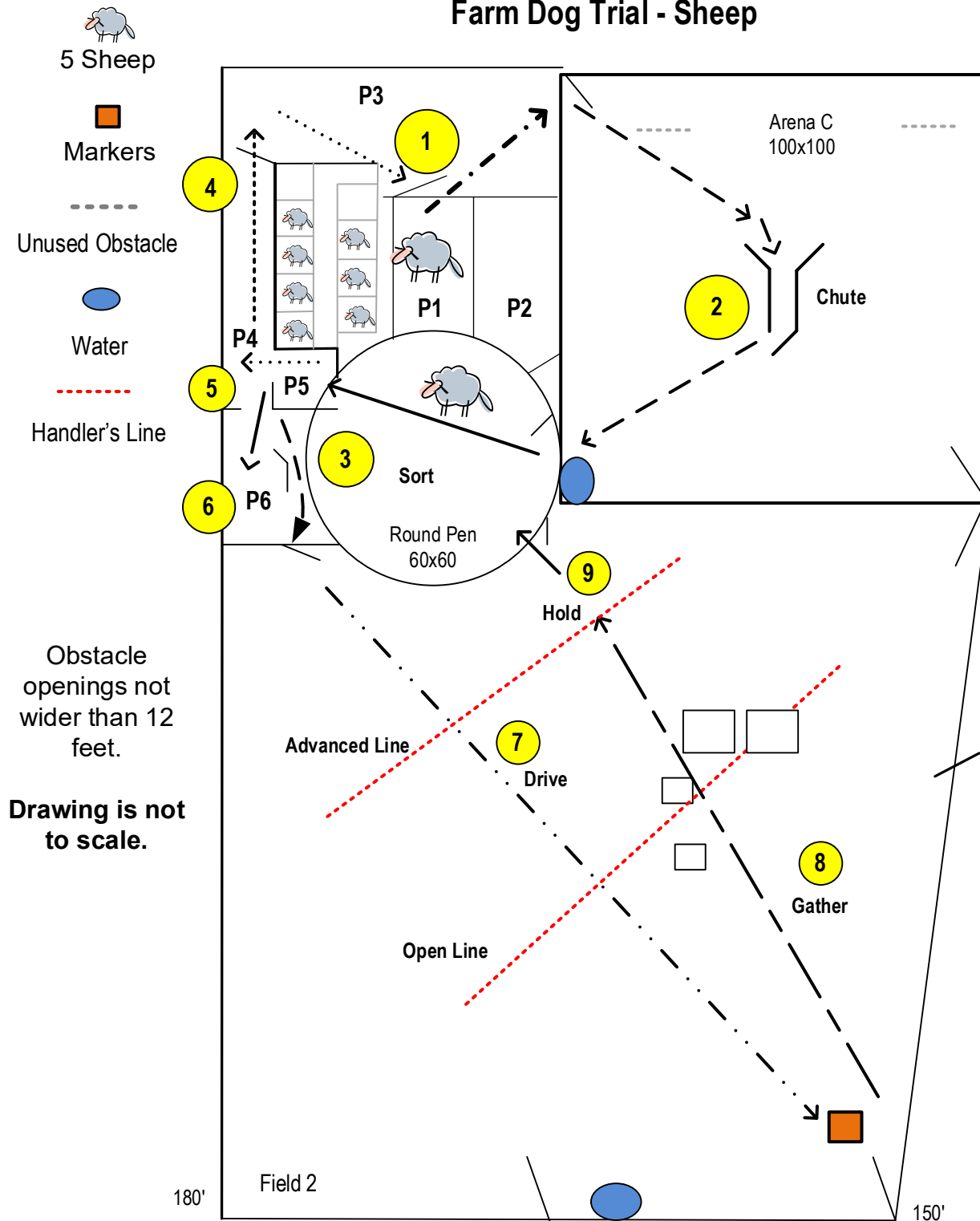
- Time: Sheep – 20 minutes
- In all elements, quiet efficient sheep work is essential.
- There will be sheep handlers in the vicinity of the Round Pen.
- Sheep should be safely held off all gates.
- Gates may be pre-set to increase safety but must be returned to the closed position before leaving the area.
- Ties are broken based on individual scores in the following order:
Exercise #2 “Obstacle #1”, Exercise #4 “Pens”, Time.

STARTING SET- UP:

- 5 sheep in Pen A, 5 sheep in Round Pen, additional sets of sheep in Holding Pens.

1. **PEN #1 – 5 pts.:** Exercise begins when the gate to Pen 1 is opened. NOTE COLLAR COLOR. Remove sheep from Pen 1 and move them through Pen 3 and into Arena C. Exercise ends when Arena C gate is closed.
 - **Open:** Handler may enter the pen and assist the dog.
 - **Advanced:** Handler remains outside the gate
2. **CHUTE – 20 pts.:** Exercise begins when Arena C gate is closed. Move sheep into the Chute and apply simulated pour-on. Dog is to hold sheep in the Chute while using pour on. Remove sheep from Chute and move to Round-Pen gate. Exercise ends when the Round Pen gate is opened.
3. **SORT – 25 pts.:** Exercise begins when the Round Pen gate is opened. Move sheep into the Round Pen and combine with additional sheep. Sort **original** Round Pen Sheep into Pen 5. Sort must be correct. Exercise ends when sort is complete.
4. **PEN #2 – 5 pts.:** Exercise begins when sort is complete. Remove sheep from Pen 5, move through Pen 4 and Pen 3, pen sheep in in Pen 1. Exercise ends when Pen 1 gate is closed.
5. **PEN #3 – 5 pts.:** Exercise begins when Pen 1 gate is closed. Return to the Round Pen and move remaining set through Pen 5 into Pen 4. Move sheep from Pen 4 into Pen 6. Exercise ends when sheep are in Pen 6 with the gate closed.
6. **PEN #4 – 10 pts.:** Exercise begins when the gate to Pen 6 is closed. Move sheep through footbath in Pen 6 and then into Field #2. Exercise ends when sheep are in Field #2 when the gate to Pen 6 is closed.
7. **DRIVE – 20 pts.:** Exercise begins when Pen 6 gate is closed. Drive sheep to the Drive Marker. Exercise ends when the sheep reaches the Drive Marker.
 - **Open:** Handler may move up to the Open Handler's Line.
 - **Advanced:** Handler remains behind the Advanced Handler's Line until sheep reach the Final Drive Marker.
8. **GATHER – 20 pts.:** Exercise begins when the sheep reaches the Drive Marker. Recall the dog and move to a location appropriate for the team's level. Send the dog to gather the sheep to the Round Pen Gate as indicated on the map. Exercise ends when the sheep reaches the open area in front of the Round Pen Gate.
 - **Open:** Dog is positioned at the Advanced Handler's Line; Handler may move up to the Open Handler's Line.
 - **Advanced:** Handler and Dog begin behind the Advanced Handler's Line. Handler may move up to the Open Handler's Line after the dog has passed the Open Handler's Line.
9. **HOLD – 20 pts.:** Exercise begins when the sheep reaches the open area in front of the Round Pen. Hold the sheep. When the judge calls the Hold, move the sheep to the Round Pen Gate and pen the sheep. Exercise ends when the sheep are penned.

Over-Night Parking at PackLeader Farm

Thank you for attending the event being held at PackLeader. We hope your stay will be enjoyable. We are trying to accommodate the needs of many people who are bringing recreational vehicles and/or camping at this event so we thought it would be helpful to provide some guidelines that hopefully will let everyone enjoy their stay.

- ✓ Please check in with the committee or facility owner prior to parking your vehicle. We need to have parking organized so we can accommodate the number of vehicles we are expecting. Someone will give you directions on where to park.
- ✓ Please fill out the attached form with some information so if we need to locate you while you are attending the event we can do so.
- ✓ If you are using a generator, please be considerate of your neighbors as to the time you have it running, especially at night.

Please help out by monitoring your dogs:

- ✓ All dogs must be contained or on lead at all times while on the facility property (unless you are using an area that is specified as off-lead). The arenas should not be used for exercising and pottying your dog(s) as it is distracting to the dogs that are expected to perform in those areas.
- ✓ Dogs should not be left in x-pens while you are away from your vehicle. There is a lot of activity going on during the event and we wouldn't want anything to happen so that your dog escapes.
- ✓ Aggressive behavior of your dog(s) toward other dogs, livestock or humans is not permitted.
- ✓ Please pick up after your dogs while you are at the facility.
- ✓ Please avoid fence lines/gates where guardian dogs are working.

In the case of damage to the facility, (fences, gates etc.), I will pay the cost of repairs.
