

Newbie – Elmer Committee

Newbies join the West Valley ARC from all walks of life. Young and old, men and women, electronic professionals to farmers. They all have one golden asset... a new license and a keen ambition to learn! The committee was handed a daunting task of "what is next" for these new members? So many of them join... then fall out of the club. It is doubly troubling with the COVID quarantine limiting social interaction.

<u>President Danny, KM4HFT</u> asked me to form a committee to stop this hemorrhaging and identify new members. To come-up with procedures to aid inquisitive new members with useful tools and beginner radios so they can get on the air, experience our many and varied nets and most importantly... get to know many of our valued members!

The committee (at our first Zoom meeting) purposed and later confirmed by the membership, to buy new radios. We had one goal in mind... get newbies on the air quickly so they could:

- 1. Overcome mic freight
- 2. Get to know our nets and members
- Become familiar with ham procedures, Q signals and the possibilities ham radio offers
- 4. Become exposed to wide coverage repeaters
- 5. Identify club Elmer's so new hams can ask "dumb questions!"

We purchased the radios after the club's approval and delivered them to <u>Gary Robin, K9HDU</u> for mating with the power supplies. Gary, of course, did his usual quality work and even dressed the cables and tuned the mobile antennas.

Then the radios were transferred to <u>Curt Faulk</u>, <u>N6ATC</u> for programming. He contacted RT Systems and explained to them how newbies to our club were going to utilize these radios. <u>RT Systems</u> <u>donated</u> the programming software to the WV

<u>Club</u> with the understanding that it would not be passed around and would permanently reside on one computer.

- 1. Frequencies were chosen that highlighted our club repeater (147.300) and our unofficial simplex frequency, 146.58.
- Curt programmed the radios with repeater frequencies such as ARA, Rim Link, Metrolink and EARS along with other regional repeaters.

Each month membership chairperson, <u>Krissy</u>
<u>Larson, KI7GJJ</u>, sends the committee a list of new hams that have just passed their test or are new to the club migrating from other states.

The first radio was loaned out to a newbie ham, Julia Korytkowski, KC7ZVO.

<u>Gary Franklin, (K8BKB</u>), set up a loaner agreement that requires a check for the full replacement value.

We are holding meeting to discuss what information should be included in the Newbie packets. The ARRL is also working with the committee on charts, Q signals, HAM slang and other information to make it easier to get acclimated.

Gary Franklin (K8BKB), Bill Ciccon (KA2KHV), Larry Johnson (WO7C) and Ray Madison (WB7VZI) are the first set of "Elmers." These guys have already contacted several new hams and encouraged them to become involved.

The newbie and Elmers information will soon appear on the club website, Facebook and monthly Short Skip to offer more contact info.



I've had the privilege of seeing several of our member's ham shacks and there sure are some impressive ones in our club! I will be on the road when we do our Virtual Ham Shack tour on September 19th so I won't be able to show off my ham shack, or should I say: "Ham Desk". My setup is not as cool as some of yours, but it meets my needs. My Ham Desk is in a corner of my personal office – it has to share the room with all of my other toys.

I have a VHF/UHF vertical antenna in my attic and a secondary UHF/VHF magnetic mount antenna in the attic. My HF antenna is a portable buddy pole that I setup and take down.


On my desk, I have an Astron RS-35M power supply, an Icom IC-2000 2m mobile unit (my back-up radio), and my Ham-Shack-in-a-box Yaesu FT-991A HF/VHF/UHF All Mode Transceiver. The Yaesu is compact and travels nicely with my buddy pole to my favorite camp spot. I also have a Kenwood TH-D74 144/220/430 Hand Held. I have a pi-star hotspot that I use for Fusion and D-Star. Finally, I have a Surface Pro 3 that I use as my radio laptop and a Raspberry Pi I use for fun. I have my Yaesu connected to a small speaker on my desk and to a network of bluetooth speakers that are scattered around the house. No matter which room I'm in, I can listen to the net! Late at night, I use headphones so I don't disturb anyone trying to sleep!

In the summer, my office gets warm with all the computers and radio gear. In the winter it is the coziest room in the house and you'll often see a bowl with bread dough sitting on my power supply – the warmth helps the dough raise.

I plan to join the Virtual Ham Shack tour on Sept $19^{\rm th}$ assuming I have WiFi. However, you'll have to look at my mobile unit or the airbnb we rented in Door County.





