RULES & REGULATIONS

1. No limit on entries.
2. All entries must be homemade.
3. Wines must be bottled in 750 ml. bottles.
4. All bottles must be securely corked or capped.
5. Each bottle must be labeled with description of contents, per chart on the right
6. Each bottle will be assigned a number and class by a member of the wine committee at the time of entry.
7. All ribbons will be awarded on the Opening Day of the Fair.
8. All wine entries must be submitted by 5:00 PM on Friday, August 9th at the SCFF Office.
9. The Fair management will exercise diligence to insure the safety of exhibits but, in no case will be responsible for damage or loss.
10. All entries must be picked up Sunday afternoon at 3:00 PM on the second floor of the Four Season Centre.
11. All opened bottles will be dumped after judging due to liability issues.

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All work must be in the hands of the superintendent of wood-carving at the Fine Arts Building at the fairgrounds between 1:00 and 2:00 P.M. on the Sunday, August 13th, prior to the start of fair week. No carvings will be accepted after this time.
2. Each carver will be responsible for picking up his/her entries on Monday after the fair, between 9:30-10:30 A.M.
3. All entries must be accompanied by a sheet listing the carver's name, address and phone number, plus a listing of each piece to be shown. and insurance value of each carving. Work exhibited will not be insured against damage or theft. This is the responsibility of the artist.
4. All carvings will be for display only, with no official judging or competition to be conducted.
