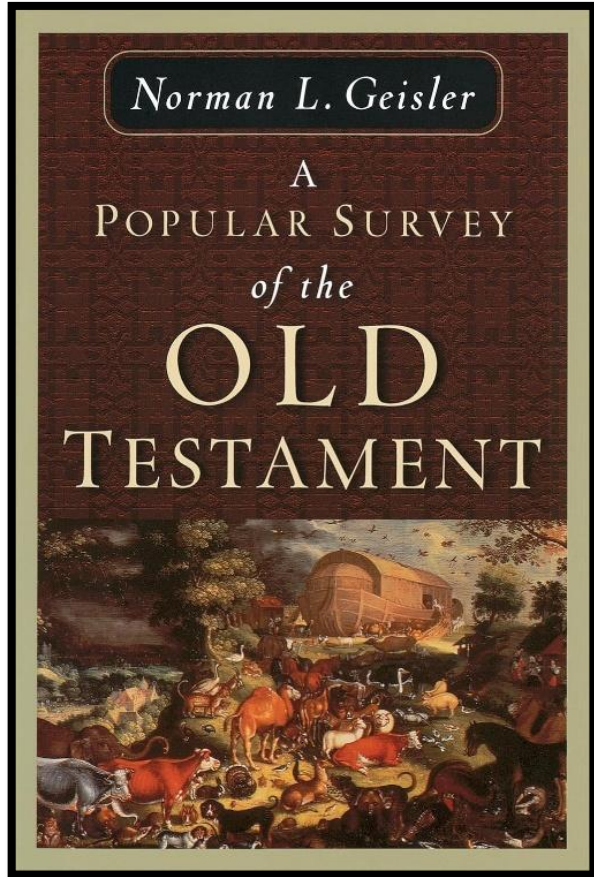

Description of Course:

This course provides an in-depth study of the first five books of the Old Testament: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy, collectively known as the Pentateuch or Torah. Students will explore the theological, historical, and literary significance of these foundational books, tracing God's covenantal relationship with His people from Creation to the threshold of the Promised Land. Special attention will be given to the authorship of Moses, the major themes of law, grace, holiness, and redemption, and the Pentateuch's relevance to New Testament theology and Christian leadership today.
