Description of Course:

This course is a study of the thirteen New Testament letters written by the Apostle Paul, addressed to churches and individuals across the Roman world. These writings—Romans through Philemon—form the heart of Christian theology and provide practical guidance for faith, doctrine, and daily living.


Students will explore the historical and cultural background of Paul's ministry, the circumstances behind each letter, and the major theological themes such as justification by faith, grace, the work of the Holy Spirit, sanctification, church unity, spiritual gifts, and Christian conduct. Special attention will be given to Paul's missionary journeys, his relationship with the churches he founded, and the challenges faced by the early Christian communities.
